THE SPECIAL SESSION

Gov. C. Ben Ross was expected to issue his formal call today for a special session of the Idaho legislature.

Concerning the first of the two expressed objectives for the session, little explanation is necessary. An additional \$50,000 per month is sought from sales tax funds in order to supplement relief money—mostly in order to pay old age pensions.

At present \$100,000 monthly is furnished from sales tax funds for relief. All receipts over that go into a general sales tax fund. On this excess there was a balance of \$40,875 in cash on June 30. The legislature will be asked to devote some of that excess toward social security.

The second question to be presented, however, is less widely understood. This is the request for added operating money for the Idaho department of agriculture's inspection bureaus.

Operating funds of these bureaus are practically depleted at present because of increased inspection work as farming output speeds up in the state. Inspectors have been fringing in more money to the department, but haven't been able to touch it for purposes of making inspection staffs adequate.

The legislature will either have to appropriate more money for the inspection bureaus, or else revert to the law passed by the 1933 legislature which let the bureaus operate on a "continuous appropriation" basis, giving them access to the funds they collected.

Passage of legislation aiding these bureaus will ease a somewhat tense situation between the department and the Idaho Shippers' Traffic association. The association filed a prompt and lusty protest when Commissioner F. Lee Johnson raised the inspection rate from \$3 to \$5 on each lot of onions and potatoes containing sacks weighing under 100 pounds each.

That protest brought rescinding of Johnson's order by Governor Ross, who said he hadn't known about it and wouldn't have allowed it if he had.

And that's the special session in a nutshell.

Pilot Blew Yawl to Honolulu As First Finisher in Pacific Race

HONOLULU, T. H., July 18 (AP)—The 61-foot Dora, a Frisco built by the Newcomb brothers of New York and brought to the coast by young James H. Frisco, was today added to the racing honors materially today by being first in the annual Santa Monica to Honolulu contest, racing class of the Pacific coast.
