Snake Torture Killer Cowers in Cell After Officers Hanging

LOS ANGELES, July 26 (UP)—Robert S. James, who faked last night after a jury condemned him to hang for the rattlesnake torture murder of his seventh wife, cowered on his cell floor today.

The abolitionist and first-faced barber was gaunt, pale and low-spirited from losing "sleep" during the night.

James refused breakfast for the first time since he went behind bars more than a month ago.

"Go away," he snarled at the turnkey, with whom he had parted last night laughing. "Well, I guess they hung it on me."

Nothing was wasted, but it was James' fault. Throughout the nine hours and nine minutes of the execution, James' decision on the case of the first-faced barber, he offered to make a confession.

When a jury of 10 men and two women returned a verdict of guilty, James said he would not plead guilty.

"Well, I guess they gave me the wrong jury," he said.

James left the courtroom, where he found his guilty of the first wife murder of Mary Hatch James, last night with the boy, "I can take it—I'm not afraid."

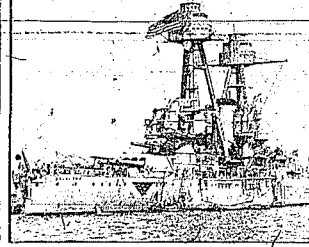

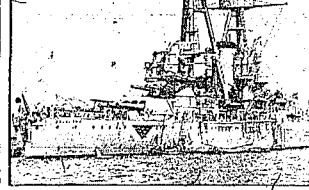

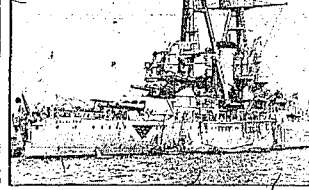

BRUNDAGE REFUSES TO HEAR PLEADINGS

BERLIN, July 25 (UP)—Mrs. Eleanor Holm-Jarrett today pleaded with her effort to be reinstated on the United States Olympic team.

BERLIN, July 25 (UP)—Avery Brundage, president of the American Olympic committee, today ordered Secretary-Fredrick W. Hubben to withdraw the entry of Mrs. Eleanor Holm-Jarrett in the Olympic 100-meter backstroke.

Mrs. Jarrett's entry had not yet been withdrawn from the official list which she claimed from the American team Thursday night.

Brundage said that the United States Olympic committee is concerned the Jarrett matter is irreconcilably closed.

Brundage's action—if it stands—removed any hope that the 100-meter backstroke who won the Olympic title in 1932 and swam on the United team in 1932, might be allowed to compete in the games opening next Saturday.

Olympic rules, a competitor cannot be re-entered once he or she has been withdrawn from the entry list, which already has closed.

Brundage commented, caustically, by the incident he ordered Hubben to withdraw Mrs. Jarrett's name.

"In all conscience we cannot re-instate Mrs. Jarrett because we have no team as yet," Brundage said.

Mrs. Jarrett openly flouted her authority and the board of directors of the American Olympic committee which she had appointed yesterday after she had appointed her own committee.

A petition signed by many members of the American team was discussed by Brundage.

While Eleanor was preparing to renew her battle, Uncle Sam's Olympic village on the outskirts of Berlin is expected to open next week after eight days on the ocean.

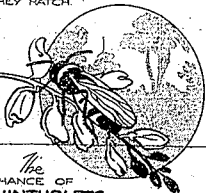

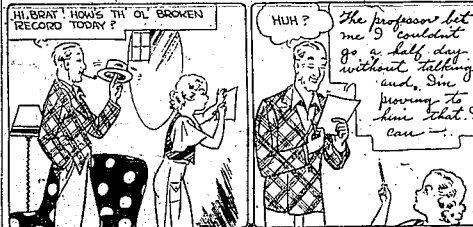

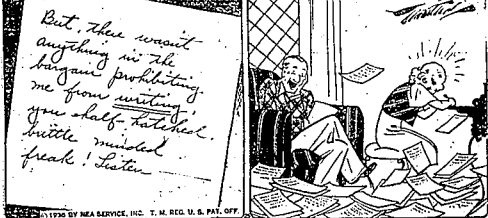

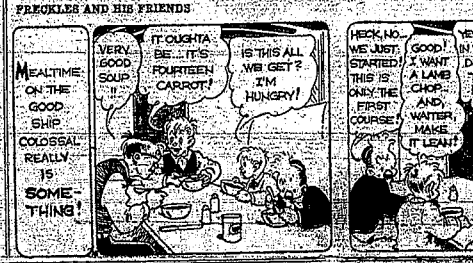
