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# PLANS MADE FOR ARMY'S ARRIVAL

Site Picked and Commitment Named for Battalion Visit Aug. 17-18

Major R. H. Bacon, Ft. Douglas, Utah, returned to his post today following a conference here with members of the executive committee of the Twin Falls American Legion for the visit here Monday and Tuesday, Aug. 17 and 18, of 125 officers and men making up a provisional battalion of the 38th Infantry regiment.

The good-will tour is being made in the interests of the army recruiting campaign and will include visits to four Idaho schools and possibly other points to be made by the group traveling in 25 vehicles.

Twin Falls there will be almost all parade, concerts by the crack 40-piece military band, platoon formations and possibly gymnastics, according to the committee headed by Capt. R. E. Livingston of the Legion.

To Pitch Tents

The battalion members will pitch tents on the junior high school playground and the new school building and will maintain overnight camp. Contracts have been made for possibly supply men to furnish ration, ice, straw for bedding and water lights and showers.

Other cities where the battalion will make stops include Idaho Falls during the department convention of the American Legion, Pocatello and Boise.

Commitments were made by Ed Dyer, post commander, to assist Capt. Livingston with plans here include S. J. Grant, J. J. Haines, Fuller, Clarence McCoy, John C. Halsey and James H. Sloan, the latter two on publicity.

## BOYS MAKE OWN DIVING OUTFIT

### Ohio Youths Convert Top of Old Boiler Into Helmet For Lake Erie Use

JEFFERSON, O., Aug. 6 (Special)—A group of boys at Jefferson, Ohio, have converted an old boiler into a diving helmet and with the aid of two automobile pumps, several feet of hose and an old telephone set they are able to explore the bottom of Lake Erie.

The "helmet" fits over the diver's shoulders with two leather straps passing under the arms to hold it in place. Another tubing around the part contacting the diver's body prevent the diving set from leaking.

Three persons are necessary to operate the "whallow water" diving suit. Two pumps are used to compress air into a tank, the air and slips down into the helmet for a lake-bottom stroll.

## NEUTRALITY MOVE FAVORED BY DUCE

Director Accepts Proposal of France in Principle; Lists Conditions

ROME, Aug. 6 (Special)—Premier Benito Mussolini has accepted in principle the French proposal for a neutrality agreement in the event of a Spanish crisis. The conditions are listed below:

1. The cessation of enrollment of volunteers, the raising of public subscriptions and manifestations and press campaigns in favor of either faction.
2. Assurance that a non-interference pledge will be entered and that it will bind both governments and private individuals.
3. Information whether France proposes some form of control to supervise the application of any neutrality agreement.

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SCIENCE MAKES ODD DISCOVERY

Evidence Discloses Dinosaurs Are Approximately Three Bushels of Stones

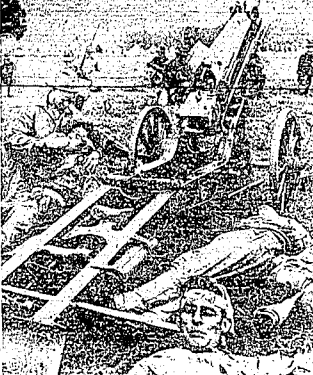

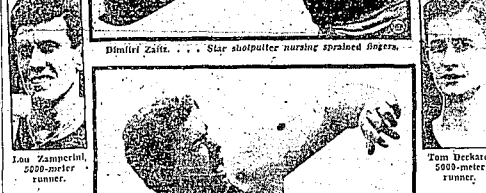

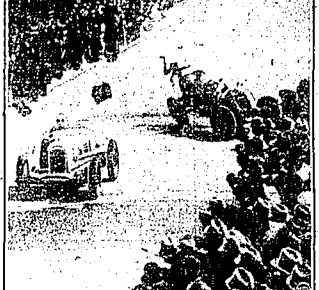

# ROSS, McCONNEL DISCUSS STRIKE

Situation in Northern Idaho Under Control Asserts Chief Executive

# NAME DORM FOR U. OF I. FOUNDED

Wills Sweet Hall in Name Chosen for \$250,000 Edifice

MOSCOW (Special)—Representatives of the University of Idaho have paid honor to one of the men who played a leading part in the founding of the university in 1890 by naming the new \$250,000 men's dormitory under construction "Wills Sweet Hall."

For many years more prominent in Idaho's late territorial and early state history than Wills Sweet, a famous lawyer, he lived in the little frontier town of Moscow in 1881. His aggressiveness and ability soon made him one of the leading men in the territory.

It was he who really began the movement to found a territorial university and became U. of I. Moscow. He wrote the bill establishing the institution, and guided it through the legislature. Jan. 30, 1890, Governor Stevenson utilized his interest in the state's future higher educational affairs by appointing a first board of regents.

He was district attorney for Idaho territory in 1886-89, associate justice of the territorial supreme court for several years, and one of the framers and signers of the state constitution in 1890.
