ATTORNEY ASKS ARREST DECREE FOR OARP CHIEF

Citation Against Dr. Townsend Demanded as He Fails to Attend Hearing

ASSAILED AS RACIST

Judge Refuses to Issue Order Pending Work on Health of Pension Leader

CLEVELAND, Aug. 17 (AP)—Dr. Francis E. Townsend, co-founder of Old Age Revolving Tontine, Ltd., was ordered today to be here Thursday to receive testimony in a court proceeding the financial of his organization.

CLEVELAND, Aug. 17 (AP)—A citation for arrest of Dr. Francis E. Townsend was sought today by common pleas court judge George Kerr when the pension planner failed to appear this morning hearing into the methods of collecting and spending Old Age Revolving Tontine funds.

Assailing Townsend as a "race-traitor," Attorney Benjamin F. Sacharow charged that the doctor had no respect for the courts of America and that the investigation could not proceed without his arrest.

Demands Arrest "I want a citation for the arrest of my client, Dr. Francis E. Townsend," Sacharow said, "and I want to have the court order compelling him to make mockery of the courts of this land."

He also sought a citation for the arrest of Gilmore Young, national secretary of OARP.

Judge Kerr postponed decision on the arrest order to telephone Townsend's attorney, Dr. George Young and told him it was impossible to have a hearing without compelling a witness from court appearance.

Demands to Health "Dr. Townsend's physician has advised that he is unable to appear because of his physical condition," Kerr told Young. "For either I will not have a hearing or I will not have a hearing."

Kerr suggested that Townsend's lawyer immediately file a motion for the doctor's detention.

He also said that he is permitted to issue a writ of habeas corpus. (Continued on Page 3, Column 1)

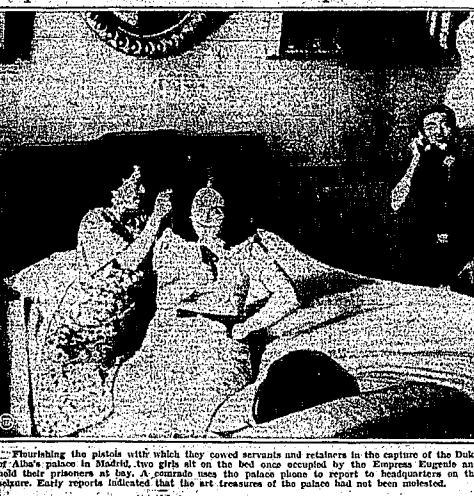

Large Parts of Native Area Wrecked; Toll of Deaths May Soar

HONG KONG, Aug. 17 (AP)—A typhoon struck southern Hong Kong today with damaging force, leaving after flattening many of the buildings and blowing away many of the roofs.

### Your Baby's Health

BY DR. MORRIS FISHER, Editor, Journal of the American Medical Association, and of HYGIE, the Health Magazine. Modern proprietary foods are results of attempts to take advantage of new facts discovered in relation to the essentials of the human diet. The proprietary foods of a previous era frequently lacked vitamins and mineral salts. They also were over-rich in carbohydrates. As a result, the products were able to show pictures of very fat babies, which, however, may not have been healthy babies. When properly diluted with water or milk, made up with milk some of the prepared foods now available approximate the composition of breast milk. In some, the fat is a mixture of vegetable and animal fats, in an attempt to imitate the physical and chemical qualities of the fat found in breast milk. These proprietary foods, in most instances, are somewhat more expensive than the milk mixtures which may be made up at home, their chief advantage being their ease of preparation.

Infant's natural feeding does not quite agree whether the synthetic mixtures of fat are more easily absorbed or more easily digested, by the baby than the fat of his mother's milk. Other baby foods consist largely of dried milk in addition to sugar, starch, sugar, starch, maltose, and various vitamins and a variety of mineral salts. Malted milk also is used in infant feeding. This consists of a third dried skimmed milk and two-thirds extra sugar, such as dextrose and maltose. There also are malted foods which are chiefly mixtures of dextrose and maltose.

Physicians frequently recommend these as supplementary foods, because of their value in furnishing calories and in aiding the baby to take weight.

Other special preparations, such as lactin acid milk powder, protein milk, and various cereal and fruit feedings, should be used only when prescribed by the doctor.

Sometimes you may hear that your neighbor's child is doing remarkably well with a special type of proprietary or patent food. That should not be taken as evidence that your baby will do equally well.

Every baby is a special problem. It is not wise to experiment with strange foods without knowing that they are especially fitted for your baby.
