AUTO FATALITIES AT 61 FOR IDAHO

July Total Added 16 More to Year's Figure; State Has 881 Births

BOISE, Aug. 21 (Special)—Auto fatalities in Idaho this month, 61 in number.—August, 1938, total 175, it is reported by Mrs. P. E. Dillingham, director of the bureau of vital statistics. The report shows 881 births and 429 deaths. Forty infants, among one-year-olds during the month, and 16 more were stillborn.

Of the births, 495 were males and 416 females. Of the deaths 295 were males and 140 females. There were 101 suicides and 62 accidental deaths of which 12 were drownings, two accidents poisoning, one from gas, two from falls, three from motor vehicles, one from lightning, one crushed, one injured by an animal, one from electrical shock, one from lightning, and five by other external violence.

More Drownings
The first seven months claimed 22 drownings in Idaho, more than any other year in this state. At the present rate the 40 will be about the total. Spotted fever had claimed the lives of six.

The principal cause of death was heart trouble with 62, coming next with 33 and pneumonia and flu third with 31. The white plague, tuberculosis, took 14.

Your Baby's Health

Additional foods to the baby's diet depends on the supply of breast milk, but it is customary nowadays to add foods somewhat earlier than was done formerly. By the seventh or eighth month, however, there is hardly a baby that is not getting extra nourishment from sources other than the breast.

Additional foods include such substances as pured, or sieved, vegetables, cereals, acroped meats, liver and eggs. These substances should be added one at a time to determine the baby's reaction. Usually it takes two or three days to find out whether a change in the diet is beneficial.

Orange juice may be given during the first month. Two tablespoons, mixed with an equal quantity of water, may be given once or twice daily.

When the baby is 3 months old, it may have the juice of one-half orange daily, and after that, the juice of a whole orange every day. Occasionally tomato, or other fruit juices may be substituted for the orange juice.

Cod liver oil should be started early in infancy, beginning with a half-teaspoon each day and gradually increasing to one or two teaspoons by the time the baby is getting three or four times a day. This should be continued through infancy to make certain of preventing rickets in a normal baby.

Many doctors believe that a baby should have extra iron early in infancy.

It is customary to begin the cereals when the baby is 6 or 7 months old. The new strained or

juiced vegetables and fruits make every good beginning feeding, the child vegetables much earlier than was formerly possible. Egg yolk also may be given at an exceedingly early age since it is the source of many essential food substances.

Do not change the baby's food every day. The baby a symptom of indigestion may be suffering with a digestive disturbance, a much better rule is to stop all food at once and call a doctor.

Whether a baby should be forced to eat certain foods is the matter of considerable debate among experts. There are two schools of thought. One group of psychologists insists that children should be taught to eat everything.

Allergists, those specializing in the study of sensitivities—assert, however, that persistent refusal of any single food indicates the child may have some sensitivity to that food and is better off without it.

Since many of the foods which contain vitamins and mineral salts in plentiful are not necessarily sweet or appealing, and since children are likely to eye them with suspicion, the mother should be certain that the child is really sensitive to a food before she accepts the idea that sensitivity is responsible.

CAR DEATH RATE SEEN ON DECLINE

First Six Months in Gem State Records Reduction from 1937 Totals

BOISE, Aug. 21 (Special)—While a constantly mounting toll of automobile deaths rolled on this year—in 20-out-of-22 states west of the Mississippi river, Idaho's department of motor vehicles today reported a sharp decline.

Last year 27 people died in automobile accidents between Jan. 1 and July 31; this year the total for the same period was reduced to 27, a drop of 27 per cent since last year.

R. H. Forney, national safety council statistician, said there were notable exceptions in the constantly mounting accident trend. Idaho was one of these.

Other States

North Dakota reported a reduction of 23 per cent in its automobile death toll. Traffic deaths in Nevada during the first six months of the year were 26 per cent below a year ago, while Iowa accomplished a reduction of 13 per cent. Colorado's toll was down 11 per cent. However, there is still an eight per cent decrease.

A part of the decrease, Forney said, was explained by an up-probable eight per cent rise in the number of automobiles in the country, but he pointed out that 23 reporting states can do the Mississippi experienced a 7.6 per cent decrease in motor accident fatalities from 1937 to 1938 under the same approximate increase in automobile registration.

The council said its traffic reports showed that California, with less than half the population of New York state but almost equal automobile registration, had more people in traffic accidents to July 1 than any other state. The toll in California was 324, against 1937 for New York, 316, and New York, while New York's toll for the corresponding period of 1937, the California toll was an increase from 3215.

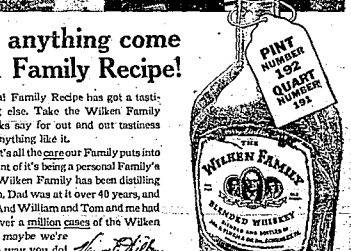

IDAHO VALUATION UP ON UTILITIES

Board Boosts Ratings Assigned O.S.L. Idaho Power and Other Concerns

Utilities in Idaho had their valuations increased by the state board of equalization today, having sitting for 10 days, studying technical questions of the commission.

The Oregon Short Line was raised five per cent, an increase of \$1,133,000 bringing the total valuation on which the company is taxed to \$31,585,470.

The board had tentatively set the increase at 10 per cent, but showings made by the company caused the board to cut the increase in half.

The valuation is only on the main line.

Idaho Power Raised

The Idaho Power was increased five per cent, also, from \$13,200,000 to \$13,860,000. The Washington Water Power company was increased 2 1/2 per cent.

The Great Northern was reduced 7 1/2 per cent and the Milwaukee and all 10 per cent. That these items are said to be suffering, financing reverses because of under valuations.

Home Payable Lumber Company Valued

The Home Payable Lumber company valuation on the basis from \$9 to \$10 a lumber per thousand feet and on logs from \$3 to \$4.

The board expected to wind up the public utility hearings this month.

Some attention was given to the report of Ada County Assessor Roy Leonardson on his increase proposal for residence tax.

A number of prominent Ada county taxpayers were present at the board hearing before the board. These included W. E. Elberg, Ernest Day, L. H. Cox, Harry S. Friedman and others.

Mr. Leonardson pointed out to the board that his valuation on the James H. Hensley had raised an order to every county assessor in the state to assess property at its full value.

Only the Ada county assessor, Herd Elsworth, complied with the order and over since that time, Ada county property has been assessed a great deal higher than any other county.

In 1930 a survey revealed that residence property was assessed 28 per cent higher than the average and business property was assessed 40 per cent higher, said Mr. Leonardson.

The board proposed to increase residence property five per cent early in the week and Mr. Leonardson asked for a rehearing.

PREN MOORE HAS POULTRY ADVICE

Extension Head Outlines Health Situation in Idaho Based on Questionnaires

BY PHEN MOORE
Extension Poultryman

According to the report made to the poultry survey questionnaires, there were 14,468 per cent more birds in Idaho in the fall of 1935 than there were for the same period in 1934. This estimate cannot be exact, but affords a means by which the preceding change in the poultry population of the state may be predicted with reasonable accuracy. This report is based upon replies from counties having 60 per cent of the chicken of the state.

The replies to the questions pertaining to the disease situation are quite encouraging, in that 92 per cent of those answering state that the disease problem is no greater or is less than in 1935. The principal diseases reported are pullorum, paratyphoid, tuberculosis, roup, and colds. Mention is made of nutritional roup, and an occasional reference is made to pick-out, blow-out, and canbalism.

According to the replies, 30 per cent of the farmers use home-mixed feeds. This does not necessarily mean that 30 per cent of the country of the state is fed home-mixed feed, but rather that approximately 30 per cent of the farmers feed home-mixed feeds.

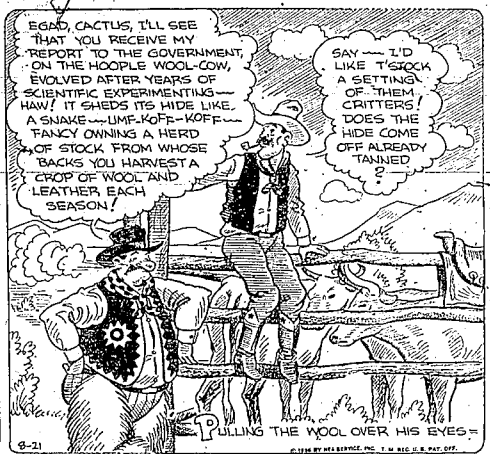
