LINCOLN LOST IN FINAL LAW CASE

That's Discovery Made After Old Records Are Found At Springfield

SPRINGFIELD, Ill., (AP)—Recently discovered court records here have disclosed that Abraham Lincoln lost his last case as a practicing lawyer.

The records were uncovered in the attic rooms of the federal building during an inventory of federal records that was being made recently.

They show that Lincoln's last law case was filed on June 22, 1859. In that case Lincoln and his partner, Herndon, defended William Ellsworth in an election dispute.

The suit asking for the presence of Ellsworth from the election was won by the plaintiff, the court holding that in addition to paying damages of one cent, Ellsworth also relinquished the land involved.

Originals Destroyed
A study of the records for the period between 1853 and 1860 showed that Lincoln had a total of 89 law cases on file during that period.

The records are believed to be the oldest existing pertaining to Illinois in the federal courts and in the United States.

They are copies of originals which were sent to Chicago and later destroyed in the Chicago fire of 1871, according to court officials.

The general court docket, which is part of the records uncovered, showed that Lincoln was especially popular as a lawyer, with hundreds of big corporate clients handled many cases for clients in reduced circumstances.

Originally filed in the circuit court, the cases were transferred to the district court in 1912, when it was established, and consequently are federal property.

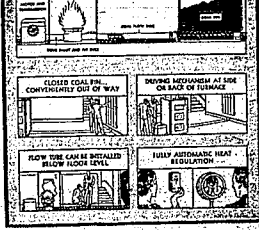

### Nervous Disorder of 30 Years Blamed for Suicide of Secretary's Son

Sergeant Francis Deschamps of the coroner's office said the letter's family physician, Dr. Frank Rhoadsford, told him Ickes had suffered from severe migraine headaches for 30 years. Ickes' death occurred on the anniversary of the death of his mother, Mrs. Anna Wilkes, who died in an automobile accident near Santa Fe, N. M.
