### Quarantine Applies to Twin Falls County Says Entomologist

HOISE, Sept. 4 (AP)—Kansas alfalfa weevil quarantine and regulations are in effect in Twin Falls county, says an entomologist here.

A letter from Dr. George A. Dean, state entomologist for Kansas brings the information, which is typical of that received from other states.

"At the close of the year there are always many requests as regards the movement of baled alfalfa into or out of the state," said Dr. Dean. "The alfalfa weevil quarantine is one of the most important of these regulations. It is a violation of the Kansas alfalfa weevil quarantine to ship alfalfa from any alfalfa field in this state to any other state."

# Your Baby's Health

One of the most important considerations in any child's education is training in health habits. I have emphasized repeatedly, this should be begun early in infancy and should be maintained regularly throughout childhood.

One of the important habits concerned in eating is feeding one's self. Most children are taught to feed themselves by the time of the second year. For a child to be fed by another after this time is abnormal and unfortunate.

The child should be taught to eat a variety of foods, and not to make an entire meal of one or two substances. While children may be fed by another, it is better to feed them with their own hands, in amounts not suitable to their years.

Especially important is emphasis on the baby's feeding itself and eating without too much trouble. The baby that reaches this stage to play with the food.

Parents encourage this by feeding the baby and amusing it during the eating. The child develops less and less desire for food, and will probably learn to vomit, just to avoid eating.

Most experts now advise that the food should be given at regular hours and, in 15 or 20 minutes, be fed away, even though milk has been eaten. The child should not be offered more food until the next regular meal.

It is hardly worth while to spend much time talking to the child, because coaxing only makes matters worse.

# BRITAIN DEVISES AID IN GAS RAID

Plans Call for Using Trucks To Pump Neutralizing Agent Into Air

PORTSMOUTH, England (AP)—Secret experiments carried out during the past two months by a number of officials in Portsmouth have resulted in a scheme to destroy gas attacks during an air raid.

They suggest that a fleet of 35 motor refuse-collectors already used by the Corporation can be transferred into a unit for dealing with gas and incendiary bombs.

Each Has Pump — The vehicles are each fitted with a powerful pumping apparatus for compressing the refuse collected into a small space. It has been found possible within a few seconds by controlling the pumps after the wastelight wagon has been filled with 1,000 gallons of water—to produce a 25-foot high spray from the roof of the vehicle.

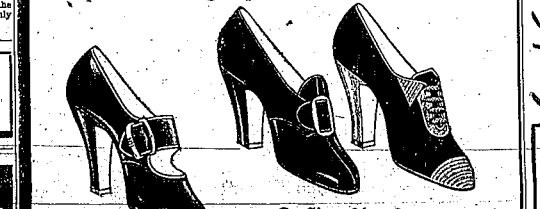

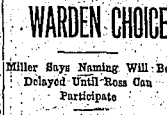
Miller Says Naming Will Be Delayed Until 'Runs Can Participate'

# FDR AND LANDON FIND AGREEMENT

### Discover Much in Common at Conferences in Iowa

(Continued From Page One)

... cooperation in water conservation projects which have also been discussed in Kansas.

There was still another point of common interest in the memorandum left with the President. Governor Landon reiterated his views on emergency and long-range, drought relief and emphasized the need for state and federal cooperation in water storage projects, especially through construction of ponds, lakes and reservoirs in order to store rainfall.

Similar to F. D. R. Plan respects similar to idea which the President had in mind when he supported, and which the Kansas governor favored, the President favored the full cooperation of his state in a program to conserve water in the western states.

The conferences among the President and the governors of Minnesota, Wisconsin, Nebraska, Kansas and Iowa, which Landon had hardly broken up last night when Secretary of Agriculture Henry Wallace said: "It was a fine conference. The President was very helpful."

"As the President could not foresee the drought, there probably was a need for more aid than was anticipated. A result of the conference would be more aid in construction of more ponds, dams and other water storage projects."

### Three-Point Program

The President, in general, discussed with the governors individually a three-point program for the relief of the drought in the western states, which Landon, as a point, the President emphasized the need for a program of better water conservation in the western states.

Secretary Landon, sitting beside Mr. Roosevelt at the desk of Gov. Clyde L. Herring of Iowa, as the President and his advisers, conversed many minutes on the various suggestions himself or the other officials.

The Republican nominee was understood to have been given the green light for the two general classifications: (1) Immediate relief of the drought; (2) long-range program calling for joint action by the government and the states.

The immediate suggestions included plans for reduced freight rates on grain, and the necessary provisions for farm families facing hunger or privation.

### Urges Care in SHINING

The Kansas governor was said to have urged greater care in shining the land line, pointing out that there were only small areas in Kansas which he thought should be retired from production.

In general the meeting was held at the state house and, last night, the President was on the presidential train, called for the meeting of chatty conversation and discussion of subjects of mutual interest.

An air of satisfaction with the developments of the day was evident among both the presidential party and the advisers of the Kansas governor.

### Gov. Landon, said he found the President "a very fine and charming gentleman" and that his own suggestions were well received.

Throughout the day, politics was the chief subject, though the President told the Republican nominee about the various studies he sponsored in fishing, a sport which Governor Landon particularly enjoys, and which he has suggested about life in the White House.

"Not only do parents benefit, but hospital library customers are aided, Miss Jones admits.

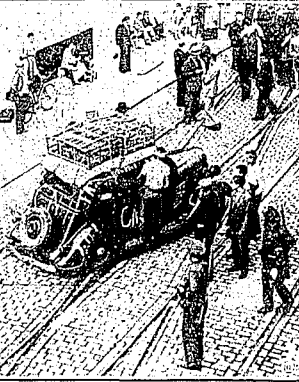

# Spanish War Has Lighter Side as Troops "Razz" Opposing Soldiers

GUADARRAMA, (Near Madrid) Sept. 4 (AP)—Up in their mountain retreat, loyalist militiamen are shaking a preliminary cocktail to the ill-fated "Fascists" in a "razz" operation. "Even in the trenches down below rebels and loyalists have abandoned their battle of bullets for a battle of words, peppered with phrases castling doubt on each other's patriotism. Outside the dug-out my mountain-climbing donkey is "hee-hawing" over the way some jovial soldiers scared me with a "beer-bottle" machine-gun. Lighter vein—

Yes, the Spanish war has its lighter side when you can forget the thousands slain and the blood and tears.

From the loyalist trenches "see-see yella."

"Fascism is ridiculous. You workers over there are cutting your own throats. Why don't you come over to the side of liberty, equality and fraternity!"

"Rebels usually listen respectfully and then make political speeches of their own. But sometimes there is heckling and a bit of cursing too. Then, when the bottle of wine waxes too hot, someone lets fly with a bullet and the war is on again.

"A temperamental donkey named Juanita fled me from the village of Guadarrama into the mountains fighting me the heat took an immediate dislike to me and catapulted me over its head.

"It's a fact! My loyalist guide explained when he checked his laughter.

"Tighten the cinch!"

As we rounded a large rock, I found myself looking into the barrel of a machine-gun and heard an ominous rat-tat-tat. Juanita again pitched nose-over her head—and I landed right at the feet of the "machine-gun" operator. His barrel was made of a sapling, its "cooling-chamber" of beer-bottles. The rat-tat-tat came from stones shaken in a tin kettle.

The noisier crew of the "gun" boasted how they had captured three fascists with it a few days before.

Presently we reached a mountain dug-out, protected by sand-bags, a tin oil kerosene lantern and a machine-gun. The dug-out occupied the place of honor.

# ARABS, ENGLISH SOLDIERS CLASH

### Three Britishers Dead as Toll Of Fierce Engagement in Palestine

JERUSALEM, Sept. 4 (AP)—The Arabs and three British soldiers were killed in one of the fiercest engagements since the beginning of the current trouble between Arabs and Jews, it was reported here today.

In addition, six Arabs and four Britishers were wounded.

A detachment of the Lincolnshire regiment took up positions on the Nablus road when an Arab band of 50 opened fire (Nablus is a city about 30 miles north of here).

Planes Sent

Nearly by a detachment of the Royal Scots they rushed to the aid of their countrymen, but found the road blocked. They then raised military headquarters to send airplanes to aid the beleaguered troops.

"The airplanes were successful in locating the engaged band.

One British machine, however, was forced to land during the early stages of the battle and Flying Officer T. E. Fisher and Aircraftman F. Lincoln were killed in the crash.

# LONDON LEADING IN EARLY POLL

### Incomplete Returns Indicate Kansas Ahead of F.D.R. By Two to One

NEW YORK, Sept. 4 (AP)—More than 25,000 ballots from four states in the first tabulation of the Literary Digest's first poll on presidential candidates gave Gov. Alf M. Landon, the Republican nominee, a two to one lead over President Hoover today.

In the four states covered—Maine, New Jersey, New York and Pennsylvania—the Digest reported Gov. Landon received 15,000 ballots to President Roosevelt's 7,545. Rep. William Lemke of Minn. and the Union Party nominee received 745 votes and 234 were scattered among the other candidates.

Called Not Reliable

The Literary Digest pointed out editorially the counted returns were meager and not a reliable basis for prediction.

The magazine also pointed out none of the ballots reported were from New York City, Philadelphia or Philadelphia's wife, President Roosevelt's strength is claimed by so many political observers to be greatest.
