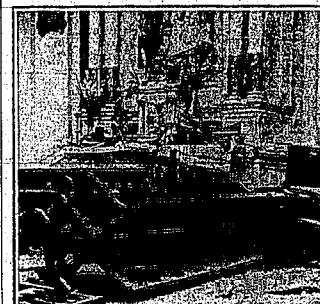

GIBRALTAR, Sept. 25 (UP)—Spanish rebel and loyalist armies maneuvered today for the initiative on the Magueta, Toledo area on which the fate of Toledo and Madrid, and the life of the left wing government, depends.

On the northern front a bloody air and land attack by rebels appeared ready to start imminently at Bilbao.

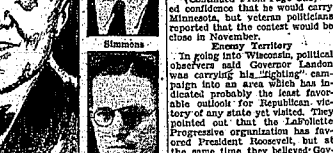

Senator Points Out Increase in Seed Prices Paid to Idaho Farmers

JEROME, Sept. 25 (Special)—"A bitter and wide spread campaign of confusing misrepresentation designed to mislead the American farmer is now being carried on by the enemies of the Roosevelt administration," said Sen. James T. Pope speaking before the Democratic rally here last night.
