FLAW FOUND IN INAUGURAL LAW

Nation Could Be Without Any President Jan. 20 Under Specific Situation

By EDWARD W. LEWIS WASHINGTON (U.S.)—The United States may be without a President Jan. 20 if the party inauguration in the new year does a study of statistics reveals.

The novel possibility was viewed by congressional legal experts as a technical danger arising out of the Norris "name clause" of the new constitution.

Under a perfecting bill passed last session Congress meets next week with only one day before the inauguration. The president-elect would be sworn in on Jan. 20.

The so-called "liberal" bloc was contained in the last session for the avowed purpose of preventing election of a member in the next year.

A close party division giving the bloc the balance of power conceivably could be maintained which would prevent organization of the House prior to inauguration.

The law passed June 5, 1931, calling for a joint session virtually at the opening of the Congress next year.

RUBBER GROWING EFFORTS PUSHED

Plant in California Reopens to Make Tires from Salinas

By HENRY WOOD
SALINAS, Calif., Oct. 8.—With rubber one of the few essential raw materials of which the United States has no domestic supply, new efforts have just been undertaken here to make the country eventually self-sufficient.

Following a shut down of 18 months, the American Rubber Producers plant has been reopened and it is expected to turn out an average of 10,000 pounds of rubber daily.

The first efforts to produce a home supply of rubber were made here in 1921. Previous to that, however, the growing of guayule had begun in the Salinas valley as early as 1908.

From 25 to 100 carefully selected and blended compounds are contained in expensive preforms.

that the campaign for an American rubber supply has been resumed. Cultivation of the guayule plant has increased to such an extent that the output of rubber for the season is estimated at 1,000,000 pounds.
