Troops Ready To Back Swift Coup
Schuschnigg Removes Rival by Bold Stroke

VIENNA, Oct. 10 (AP)—Chancellor Kurt Schuschnigg ordered troops of the Vienna garrison to maintain a "state of readiness" today to defend his sudden declaration of absolute dictatorship over Austria.

After an eight night cabinet meeting, a new official communique was issued to inform the country, the Hitlerite and the Catholic storm troopers, the two principal enemies of Schuschnigg, were dissolved completely. Selected men from them will be incorporated in a new national militia, directly under the minister of war—and Schuschnigg himself is minister of emergency preparedness.
