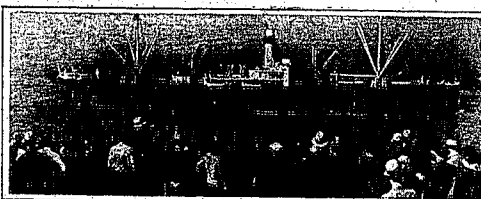

RANGE CONDITION NOW 'VERY GOOD'

Status Is 11 Per Cent Over Ten-Year Average; Stock 4 Per Cent Over

BOISE, Oct. 14 (AP)— Idaho range and range livestock are in very good condition, the division of livestock estimates said today.

Ranges are 11 per cent higher than the 10-year average. The condition of sheep and cattle is four per cent higher than the 10-year average.

Although September precipitation was below normal over most of the state, late rains worked pastures in northern Idaho.

Ample surplus supply of hay for livestock is reported in all sections. Grain feeds will be lower than anticipated because of lower yields.

A. Wallace.

Purchases will be made according to the agreement with packers, agreeing to buy an equal quantity of unprocessed prunes from growers at prices not less than the 84-cent basis. The standard prunes bought by the government will be used for distribution to families on relief rolls.

CCC RE-SEEDING BURNED REGIONS

Plants Millions of Trees in Areas Swept by Forest Fires This Year

DULUTH, Minn., (AP)—The applicant "Tommy" went their way into the woods, but the CCC youth of the Superior, national camp simply carried their forest fighting tools and staked into planting areas and are rearing timber recently destroyed by wide-sweeping blazes.

Millions of seedlings are being planted in areas formerly burned or logged.

Forest fire camps, accompanied in the dry stages of last summer, has been eliminated by heavy fall rains, and competition of live reforestation projects have begun.

Peril May Return True, another dry period after the rains have fallen will bring forested areas, in late autumn, but the normally CCC workers will take their tools from plantations, if necessary, and again wield them on the fire lines.

Some of the deadest buildings once used as logging camps by the Superior forest were re-occupied this summer by fire camps. They are now being used as planting camps.

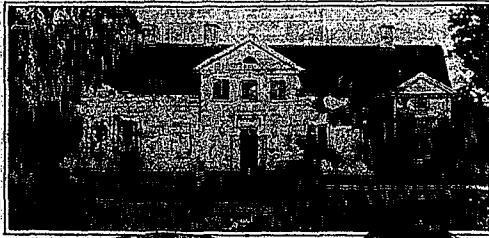

GIRLS GIVEN AS LOTTERY PRIZES

European Police Discover Wide Sweepsakes With Feminine Awards to Winners

LONDON (AP)—An international sweepstakes offering girls of all nationalities as prizes, has been discovered by European police. Tickets in the numbering game, it is believed, still are being sold in Great European countries, and particularly in the night resorts and clubs of London, Berlin, Paris, Brussels, Amsterdam and Rome.

French, Belgian and German detectives, investigating the activities of white slave traffickers, made the discovery. A number of persons suspected of being racketeers in the world's strangest lottery, or implicated in the affair, are being sought by special police.

Winners Get Choice "The Gros Lot," as the French term the principal prize, is a polychrome. Winners are offered their choice of girls of all nationalities, whose photographs are shown by secret letters of the tickets. It is said that the promoters already have conducted two sweepstakes and have delivered girls to the winners. In the last lottery, it is understood, a French and an English girl were the first two prizes. Several other girls of different nationalities went to subsidiary prize winners.

The price of the tickets varies according to the country in which they are offered, the current price in England is half a crown (approximately 25 cents) in Germany, marks (\$1.20), and in France, 10 francs (60 cents).

Promoters stipulate that the winners should be in a position to entertain their "prizes" lavishly for a reasonable number of years. Failing to satisfy the promoters on this point, the winners forfeit their rights to the prize.

Police raided the "accommodations" headquarters of the promoters in Paris. A sack of letters coming from all parts of the world demanding tickets or enclosing money for tickets already sold was seized. Letters also were taken from girls or their agents expressing their wish to be put on the prize list.

REGISTRATION BOOM POINTS TO NEW HIGH VOTE TOTALS

By United Press. Record breaking registration in all parts of the nation for the presidential election revealed a similar interest in politics. In Los Angeles there was a gain of 65,000 voters, the list having increased from 689,010 in 1932 to 754,010 in 1936. San Francisco's registration was surpassed by many thousands if voters go to the polls in any thing like the manner they flock to registration booths today. Tremendous gains were recorded along the northern seaboard. New York leading with a record of 2,899,123 voters. The figures exceeded the 1932 total by 662,318.

In Boston more than 250,000 voters have registered, surpassing the previous high in 1934 by approximately 100,000. Philadelphia, center of a fight for the electoral vote, had 1,200,000 registered, a 100 per cent increase over the 600,000 of 1932. In Chicago, 1,807,700 voters are registered, compared with 1,493,000 in the 1932 general election.

For Cook county the total is expected to exceed 2,100,000, a new high for the state.

Other mid-western cities reported new records as follows: More in Detroit—Detroit—more than 700,000, an increase of approximately 100,000. Omaha—A total of 494,000, with registrations daily, compared to 400,000 for 1932 after 40,000 names had been removed.

St. Louis—A total of 428,000, a gain of 20,559 over 1932. The situation is similar to that in Kansas City.

Records in South—Cincinnati—Registration there was attained in the south and southwest. A cross-section view of that region by cities follows: Dallas county, Tex.—80,000, a new record. Oklahoma City—86,004 with the total expected to reach 100,000.

Hirmingham, Ala.—Jefferson county (Birmingham) registration now is 101,393. Last year, 161,879. A slight decrease followed due to a decreased death rate.

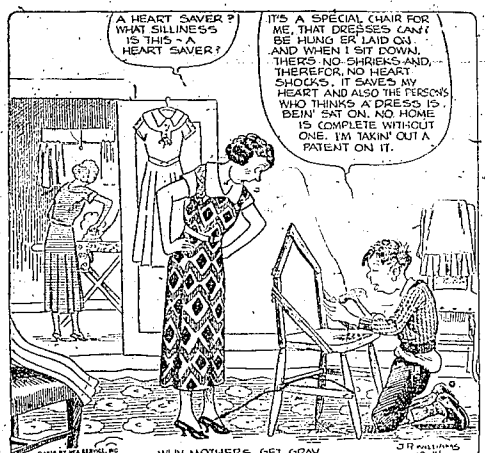

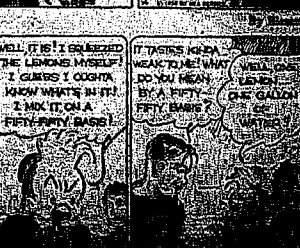
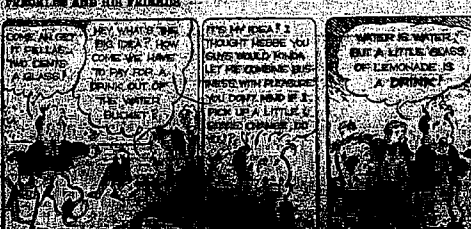

Your Baby's Health

Children differ considerably in the way they develop their teeth. They differ even in the difficulties they have during teething. But every healthful child will have teeth for relief and have poor sleep for two or three nights, when the first tooth comes through.

There may be a disposition to put fingers in their mouths and to irritate the gums in other ways. Sometimes there is considerable drooling, or flow of saliva, with loss of appetite.

There also may be slight fever and looseness of the bowels, and the appearance of undigested food in the excretions. In most instances these symptoms will last only three or four days, and there may be no pain in weight for three or four weeks.

If symptoms of teething are severe, the mother should consult her doctor promptly for aid in prevention of pain, and in encouraging development of the teeth.

It is useful also to know the ages in which the teeth usually appear. First come the two central lower teeth during the period from the fifth to the ninth month. Next are the four upper central teeth, which come in from different directions to the twelfth month.

The other two lower central teeth and the four front double teeth follow in the twelfth to the eighteenth month.

Altogether there are 20 teeth in the first set. The remainder appear between the eighteenth and twenty-fourth months, excepting the four back double teeth, which usually appear between the twenty-fourth and thirtieth months, but they may be even later.

The importance of teeth for health and long life cannot be overstated. Few mothers realize that first attention to the teeth of the child must begin before the baby is born.

The mother should visit her own dentist, early, as I pointed out in the article on prenatal care. She must keep her own teeth clean and take care of any cavities or decay while develop.

She must always eat the right foods, so that the child's teeth will develop properly. Proper foods for the expectant mother include plenty of milk, fresh vegetables, eggs, cooked fruits, cereals, and a sufficient amount of calories to provide energy.

The foods to be avoided are sweets and meat in excess, pastry, and highly seasoned substances.
