NEW ACT'S HELP**

Social Security Benefits, In Idaho Extend to 61,570, Says State Director

WASHINGTON (UPI) — The American Petroleum Institute says that the registration of motor vehicles totaled 36,000,000 at the end of 1935, of which 20,741,000, or 57 per cent, were in the United States.

The state has established public assistance plans for aid to the needy aged, the needy blind, and the disabled. These plans, plus federal aid, provide a regular income to individuals unable to provide for themselves. In September there was an estimated 7,450 acres, 240 blind, and 3,880 dependent children receiving aid from these plans at a total cost of \$28,750. Approximately one-half the cost of this aid to the blind and disabled was paid by the state and the other half was paid by the Social Security Board.

Since the state began cooperation with the federal government under the terms of the act, nearly all of the total of \$807,450 in federal funds has come to Idaho to aid it in providing these benefits.

Lots Receipts
It has received \$4,723 for additional medical aid and \$1,000 for compensation system, \$662,404 for assistance to the needy aged, \$22,500 for aid to the blind, and \$11,325 for aid to dependent children in their own homes. Federal aid has made possible for the state to provide much more adequately for its needy citizens than would be possible out of state and local tax resources alone.

In addition to these cooperative federal-state features of the social security program, the state also comes under the federal old-age benefit system provided by the act.




