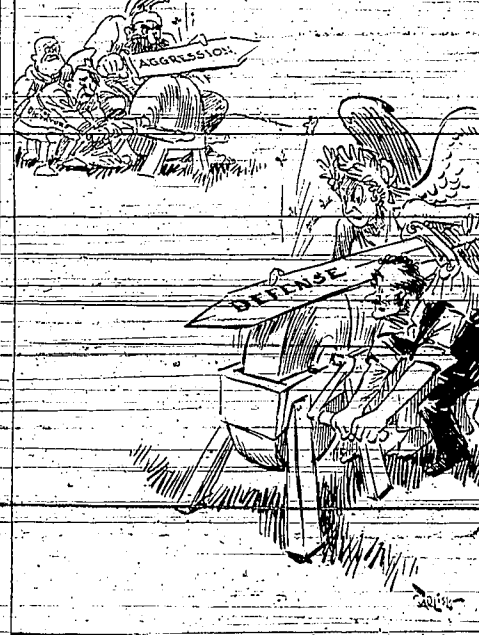

GERMAN BARTER STRIKES SNAGS

Nazi Trade Invasion Encounters Difficulties in Latin America

WASHINGTON, Feb. 9.—Henry C. Shillineau, veteran commercial attaché in Berlin, today stated that Germany's efforts to extend trade by barter agreements were encountering serious difficulties, particularly in Latin America.

In a review of last year's world trade, Shillineau noted that Germany's export sales have not increased in recent years as fast as those of the United States and Great Britain.

"Without minimizing the need for a barter system," he said, "it is a fact that Germany's barter exports to all countries from the United States to the United Kingdom are still as close to pre-depression levels as the barter trade of any other major industrial country."

Shillineau said that even in such Latin American countries as Brazil, Cuba, Peru, Ecuador, and Mexico, where German sales have increased in recent years, the barter trade has not been as successful as other than the United States.

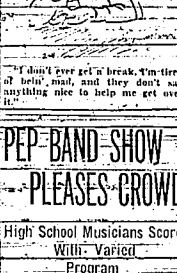
