#### 20 Measures Ready For Third Reading In Idaho's Senate

NOISE, Feb. 7 (AP)—Thirty-two measures were slated tonight for final action in the Idaho house of representatives tomorrow through the 60-day session.

Some of them were held over from today and they again be passed.

Among 20 bills ready for third reading in the senate were those:

—An act to amend the liquor laws, appropriating \$25,000 for the purchase of a new supreme court; the railroad "pullers" bill, making a felony the crime of obstructing the operation of another.

The house filed 12 bills for third reading in the senate today.

These include a bill for the use of "loss leader" merchandise by retail stores, appropriating \$10,000 for the purchase of a new automobile for the state.

Other bills include a bill for the collection of duties by a state tax collector.




