

WINDS LASH WEST AFTER HEAVY SNOW

Blizzard Rages in Utah, Blocking Highways, as Mercury Drops; Schools Closed at Cedar City

High winds brought heavy cold in the wake of heavy snow today to larger areas of the west.

At Cedar City, Utah, the blizzard caused schools to be closed for fear drifts on routes would maroon the pupils.




