### REVISION MADE IN RELIEF SETUP

#### One New Measure Would Put Public Assistance on Statewide Basis

BOISE, Feb. 23.—Further revision of legislation already the subject of several laws enacted by the 25th legislative session was proposed today by measures introduced today, part of them with administration backing introduced in the house was a bill appropriating an additional \$1,100,000 to the division of public assistance.

The legislature already has appropriated \$3,150,000 for relief costs for the biennium.

Senator E. C. Barlow (R-Oss) chairman of the public assistance finance committee, said the additional funds would permit the state to assume the new cost of the counties in matching federal funds for aid of the aged, the blind and the dependent children of the county funds.

The counties would continue to provide funds for direct relief, for which federal funds are not granted. "At present," Barlow said, "the state pays for the maximum levy of 35 mills for relief purposes in some counties but only 10 to 15 in others. The state public assistance program on a statewide basis thus permitting the counties to receive the relief funds for needy unemployed."

The bill would be introduced by Senator W. Scott Hall (O-Id) introduced in the senate a bill to provide for direct relief program which he said was offered at the request of representatives of persons in need of relief.

### TREASURY HINTS AT LOWER TAXES

#### Morgenthau Says Administration Wants Business to 'Make Money'

WASHINGTON, Feb. 23.—(AP)—The administration wants business men to "make money," Secretary of the Treasury, Morgenthau, called today for a re-examination of tax laws to see if there are any "obstacles" to business.

By stating at a press conference that the business world need fear no new tax burdens, Morgenthau re-affirmed a similar promise given recently by President Roosevelt.

The secretary's remarks were apparently an effort to encourage the economic upturn which most government economists predict will be achieved in April.

He said, first, that he had under consideration no new tax legislation, except a continuation of existing excise taxes, and expected none, except possibly a measure to raise the \$200,000 tax on farm benefits, such as President Roosevelt asked Congress for, and failed to get, last year.

In view of the notes of Morgenthau and other officials to Congress, the administration was looking forward with much interest to a major speech to be made by Secretary of Commerce, Hoover, at Hopkins tonight.

While these developments bearing on business were taking place, government economists were analyzing the economic situation and deciding that business was "pausing for breath" but that the upturn that lasted from last summer to October was still in effect.

Morgenthau said today: "The thing that bothers me is that business men—and I see a good many of them who will call a spade a spade—have an attitude on going ahead. I feel that the 'what's the use' attitude is holding back business men from expanding and taking what I would call normal business risks."

Offering the research facilities of the treasury for "the purpose," the secretary went on, "I sincerely hope that congress will take a careful look at the tax laws and see if there are deterrents holding back business men from making further commitments."

He also explained that the treasury has no hope of balancing the budget by levying new taxes, and that the way to get more revenue was to stimulate business so that present tax laws would bring in more money.

In the current and next fiscal years, the administration proposes to spend \$3,000,000,000 and incur a deficit of \$1,000,000,000 per year.
