FRENCH PREMIER SCORES VICTORY Daladier Wins Vote of Confidence on Spanish Recognition Issue

PARIS, Feb. 24 (AP) - Premier Edouard Daladier won a landslide vote of confidence today for the government's announced policy of recognizing the Spanish nationalist regime.

Announcing that he intended to propose the cabinet Monday that France recognize the Franco regime in the interests of national interest, Daladier admitted he was following Britain's lead.

Shortly after Speaker Leon Bernard, who has been negotiating for France with the nationalists, left his office from Burgos, the nationalist capital, to say he had received a second visit from the nationalist minister, Count Francisco Gomez Jordana.

The French foreign ministry said the left of the record would be broken by his speech preceding the vote Daladier alluded to in his speech.

His appeal to the chamber was a plea for a government which was hopeful, and that France's national policy was to remain a minimum leader.

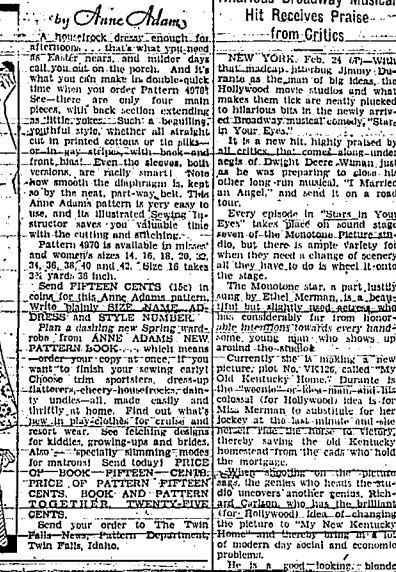

False Old Age Blamed On Economic Situation

NEW YORK, Feb. 24 (AP)—A lot of Americans are suffering from "false old age," Dr. George Lawton told the American Geriatrics Association at a symposium of aging.

These are persons whose bodies are still comparatively young, but whose emotions and habits of thought become aged unecessarily. The main reason for this, he said, is the present social and economic situation. He did not estimate the number of "falsely aged."

Age alone, he held, is insufficient as a criterion to judge a person's qualifications to work. He suggested that arbitrary retirement ages be supplemented by a more flexible system.

The highest percentage of persons over 65, said J. C. Folsom, is in northern New England. The aged over 65 are also more numerous in California than in the country as a whole and in that state he said they have become politically very active.

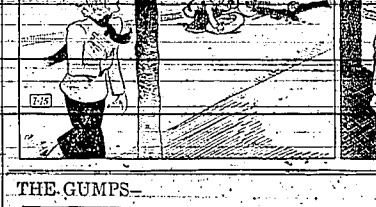
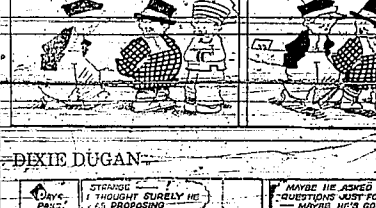
The most significant index as to what is happening in employment of these older persons is the record of gradually employed. This, he explained, has decreased continuously as follows. In 1920, 74 per cent were
