

### LABOR SECRETARY TARGET OF DRIVE

#### Coalition in Congress Seen Aiming to Restrict Powers

By KIRK J. SIMPSON  
 WASHINGTON, March 2 (AP)—Another coalition movement of anti-new deal Democrats and Republicans in congress is underfoot and this time the first woman member of a presidential cabinet, Secretary of Labor Frances Perkins appears to be the target.

Whether the movement will succeed or result in a further cabinet change beyond prediction, Frances Roosevelt has shown a determination to stand firmly behind his chief new deal ally against every attack by party dissenters. Yet he promoted former Kellogg Administrator, Hopwood to cabinet rank at the expense of Perkins who was the focal point of intra-party criticism over "politics-in-reality" charges. That took her out of the direct line of political attack.

Political analysts question whether she will in the duties for Mrs. Perkins might result in a cabinet change. There was a widespread desire among congressional Democrats for a labor-department change.

Significant Move

The circumstances of the vote in the house concerning the removal of Perkins from the labor secretary of the interior position are significant. It appears to be more significant than the Republican-sponsored impeachment of Hoover. Mrs. Perkins was reappointed by the senate on the same day that Representative Cochran, Missouri Democrat, he based his claim entirely on an entry of the work of the hour administrator Andrew.

Yet Majority Leader, Mayburn and Representative Woodruff, Virginia Democrat, warned their party colleague that the vote would be considered as aimed at Mrs. Perkins.

Representative Cox, Georgia Democrat and critic of the administration, demanded to know whether it would be possible to have a vote of lack of confidence in the labor secretary. Woodruff replied it would be considered as aimed at Mrs. Perkins.

House Votes

"Has the gentleman any doubt but that that would reflect the true attitude of the members of the house?" Cox asked.

"I would not wish to say that I would not support such a vote," Mrs. Perkins replied. "I am sure that the members of the house would support such a vote."

### SURVEY LISTS SCORE OF NEW MAJOR LAWS

BOISE, March 2 (AP)—The 25th Idaho legislature enacted into law more than a score of major measures which called for: (All will be effective on or before May 2, 1939).

1. Creation of the office of comptroller and placing in it the duties of auditing all state departments and institutions, formulating the budget and examining claims against the state funds.
2. Centralization of excise tax collection functions in a state tax commissioner.
3. Reduction of automobile and farm trucks licenses to a flat \$5.
4. Consolidation of the departments of public welfare and public assistance and placing them under direction of a non-political five-man board.
5. Settling up of a state police organization.
6. Establishment of junior college districts and maintenance by them of such institutions by local vote of the affected districts.
7. Eliminating contributions by counties to the state federal fund for the aged, blind and dependent children, and providing for relief for such entirely in the department of public assistance.
8. Transfer to the counties responsibility for caring for direct-riparian lands, providing such lands, homes, and requiring three years residence, instead of one year, before such persons can obtain aid.
9. Establishment of a livestock commission to stamp out cattle rustling, costing growers an estimated \$250,000 annually.
10. Appropriation of \$230,000 for relief of Idaho's aged, blind and dependent children.
11. Remittance of various excise taxes to the general fund instead of the public school income fund.
12. Providing for the equalization fund to permit reduction for educational purposes.
13. Authorization of employment of an attorney for the department of finance to collect claims against borrowers from the endorsement fund. Such persons who obtain aid on limitations shall not run against mortgages held by the state to secure loans on such funds and providing a constitutional amendment to be voted on by the electorate.
14. State Institutions
15. Authorization of a bond issue of \$1,000,000 for the construction of the buildings and equipment at the state charitable institutions.
16. Addition of the state highway department to the state highway fund and made sale of spotted eggs.
17. Extending time for payment of delinquent property taxes.
18. Addition of the state highway control commission and repealing of it with a non-administrative board and making the highway department to the extent of an estimated \$300,000 for the federal-aid-aid program.
19. Impairment of a one-half-cent motor fuel tax to \$0.000 for purchase of the Twin Falls inter-county bridge and re-venue.
20. Legislation of the practice of counties and the state of practicing equipment for new equipment, rather than requiring sales tax.
21. Appropriation of \$50,000 for cricket control work.
22. Appropriation of \$100,000 for noxious weed control.
23. Products Advertising
24. A levy of one-half cent per hundredweight on Idaho potatoes and onions to continue advertising.

### THREAT SIGHTED IN TRUCK BILLS

#### Idaho Interests Affected by Pending Nevada Legislation

CARSON CITY, Nev., March 2 (AP)—Nevada legislators today introduced a bill to increase the tax on trucks and buses operating on the state highways. The bill limiting truck loads to 12,000 pounds would affect the Nevada agricultural produce, over such trucks are "imposed" on the state highway which is aimed in part at opening up California markets to Idaho's produce.

Government's Advice

The "repeal" however, has been advised by the annual message to the legislature on Jan. 17, declared that if transportation agencies increase the cost of maintenance highways "you should give consideration to legislation which requires adequate compensation to the state for the additional burden imposed by such trucks."

At least eight truck and bus bills are now before senate and senate by committee with action predicted for next week.

The measures range from a levy of three cents per mile for heavy duty trucks and buses to a levy of one cent per mile for light duty trucks and buses.

Some measures call for rigid control of truck and bus operation together with designation of ports of entry.

The bill limiting truck loads to 12,000 pounds provides that this apply to all trucks and buses on highways between points now being served by railroads.

In Senate Committee

Senate committee will take up this measure tomorrow while pending before the assembly, is a similar measure, the limit being set at 18,000 pounds.

Governor Carville in his message declared "it appears as though a system transportation law which provides and insures equitable compensation to the state for the cost of construction and maintenance of public highways by trucks and buses will be introduced in the senate by the committee on corporations and transportation."

"No motor vehicle or combination motor vehicles, whether operated in interstate or intrastate commerce, shall transport over the public highways of this state any load in excess of 12,000 pounds, except as hereinafter provided."

The provision "shall not apply to motor vehicles or combinations of motor vehicles operating over highways connecting points not directly served by railway, provided, however, that motor vehicles operating over such highways shall be exempt from said (weight) limitation only if equipped with approved proper equipment or to operate in cities, towns or unincorporated areas not served by rail, and provided that no such vehicle shall be exempt from any local or city or village or unincorporated place at which appropriate loading or unloading facilities are available."

The bill also provides every vehicle transporting property in excess of 2,000 pounds must have this first indicated in stencil or white paint in a conspicuous place, designating the aggregate net weight.

Violations of this provision are made misdemeanors. As yet no agreement has been made to a 10,000 pound bill and the assembly's 12,000 pound measure.

Another measure affecting motor transportation was introduced in the senate today. The law would require that the present state gasoline tax of five cents a gallon be increased to five cents.

PARIS, March 2 (AP)—Marshal Henri Philippe Retain, 62, who fought Generalissimo Franco's war college, was named ambassador to Nationalist Spain today in the hope of ending the fighting.

The appointment of the leader of the defense of Verdun coincided with a new French effort to bring the Spanish civil war to an end with unconditional surrender of the Spanish Republicans.

Cooperation with the Nationalists to close French ports to shipments of all supplies to Republican territory was one of the first evidence of pressure on the Madrid regime.

The French action served to illustrate a declaration by Chamberlain of deputies' foreign affairs committee by Foreign Minister Georges Bonnet that France and Great Britain were working to give Nationalist Spain a quick victory while Italy seemed to desire continuation of hostilities.

The explanation of this paradoxical situation was advanced by official statements—that the Fascists wished to keep their troops in Spain as a threat to France while the two western democracies were shocked by the Nationalists that the Italian would leave immediately the conflict ended.
