## MAINTENANCE OF DUTY OF WAR TO CALLED IN QUESTION

Secretary of State Indicates 15 Legislative Measures Become Law Despite Chief Executive's Disapproval

BOISE, March 15 (AP)—Fifteen legislative measures vetoed by Governor C. A. Bottolfsen will become law despite the chief executive's disapproval, Secretary of State George H. Curtis indicated today.

Included in a bill increasing from one to three years residential requirements for persons receiving direct relief from the Idaho public assistance division and another setting up bureau of brands in the state department of agriculture, financed with a \$25,000 appropriation, to combat cattle rustling.

These bills, vetoed by the governor since the close of the session, have apparently become law, the veto notwithstanding.

Curtis said article 4, section 19, of the Idaho constitution provided that, after legislative approval, vetoed bills must be filed with the governor's objections in the office of the secretary of state within 10 days after such adjournment (Sundays excepted) or become a law.

Ten of the 15 bills carried emergency provisions, making them effective immediately. The other five would not be effective until May 2.

While scores of automobiles lined up with horns blaring in front of Scottsbluff's unlighted airport, Capt. Ray Winters, 7th Aero Squadron, was sent to the scene by the snowstorm.

Automobiles then took up the emergency errand. The Scottsbluff fire department sent a fire truck to meet an automobile starting from Cheyenne.

P. E. O'Brien of Scottsbluff said he was convinced the young couple had been bitten by a botulism poisoning although he said he could not learn what food they had eaten yesterday.

It came to the surprise of some from "highly placed" Republicans who predicted that such a solution would eventually become law, but advanced no specific proposals as to the form it might take.

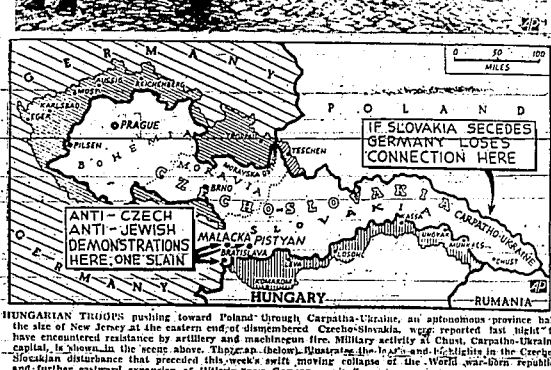

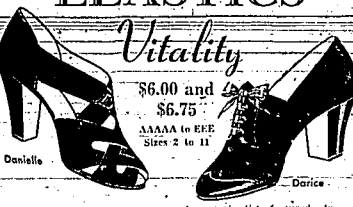

REGRETS VOICED BY CHAMBERLAIN

British Premier Excludes Germany from Conciliation Drive

LONDON, March 15.—Prime Minister Chamberlain replied to Adolf Hitler's avowal of liquidation of Czechoslovakia today by excluding Germany from the present, from Britain's drive for conciliation through peace.

Before a tense, uneasy hour of common the prime minister declared: "It is regrettable that evidence has been given to confirm all the more regrettable since evidence was given to refute."

ROAD BUILDERS SCAN FINANCES

Idaho Highway Bureau Director Tells Broad Scope of Job

BOISE, March 15.—There is more to a state highway bureau than the building and maintaining of roads, it must determine the source and amount of its revenue.

It is the responsibility of the Idaho highway department, "to furnish the fiscal basis for what is a definite highway financing program can be evolved.

It is essential that it keep the state apprised as to the status of the highway system and should effectively present such matters as it believes need attention by the legislature or other authorized body of the public.

Such taxation as we have today is the result of the pulling and hauling of many groups sponsoring their own legislation, or compromises with these groups of the need for funds adopted in the legislature for furnishing revenues sufficient for absolute minimum highway needs.
