CONGRESS BALKS ON RELIEF FUND

\$150,000,000 Additional Wanted by President May Be Cut

WASHINGTON, March 21 (AP)—The House today rejected President Hoover's appeal for an additional \$150,000,000 for relief, apparently settled down tonight to a question of cutting \$25,000,000 off that figure, or that.

With a house appropriation subcommittee ready to vote on the question, a possibility remained that the bill might be reduced to \$100,000,000 but some congressional members said indications were against such action.

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SEED POTATOES BUYERS WARNED

Idaho Agriculture Commissioner Points to New Legislation

BOISE, March 21 (AP)—Idaho farmers were warned today against "Eyo" seed potato peddlers.

E. N. Peltzgrove, state commissioner of agriculture, recalled that legislation passed by the 1938 session provided that all potatoes sold for seed must be certified or certified by a state department of agriculture.

The certificates show the name of the producer, grade and quality of potatoes, and their origin, and every buyer has a duty to see such certificates before he buys potatoes represented to be seed potatoes.

There are approximately 45 inspectors now at work in the state, Peltzgrove said.

The state legislature passed this law in an attempt to stop the sale of potatoes to protect the market for higher grade tubers.

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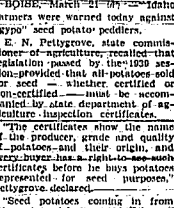

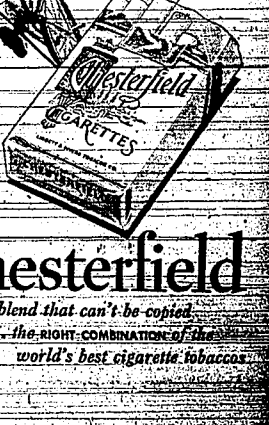

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SCIENCE FOR BOYS AND GIRLS

An unusual fair has just been held by the American Institute of Science and Engineering in New York City. That is an imposing name, but it represents an educational experiment which has been achieving happy results.

Scientists and engineers who have had the fair are boys and girls who go to the institute after school hours, to make things and to learn more about the fun of science than they have time for in school.

The fair included several hundred exhibits ranging from a tin can engine, designed, seemingly by magic, to a little Diesel engine which worked—although a little less than perfectly. The jiggling manikin was the work of a 12-year-old boy who made the figure and the "wooden train" which ran on a track he designed, and formed, and rigged up the electrical control by which it operated. It involved an old door-graph which had been converted into a telegraph sender, and other marvels understood to be scientifically initiated.

AIR POWER

American air motors are now taking the lead again, after having been surpassed by foreign motors for many years. The new type, a 12-cylinder, inverted V, produces 500 horsepower and weighs only 140 pounds. That means only about one-and-a-quarter pounds per horsepower. In the World War, our motors, good as they were in comparison with foreign types, weighed more than ten times as much as this horsepower.

The shape of the motor, too, adds to its efficiency by diminishing wind resistance. This is only one of the many developments indicating that in power, speed and efficiency our airplanes, for war and peace, will soon be the best in the world. In size and power, the new 70-passenger flying boat soon to be built by the Navy will be an eye opener. The flying boat is really here at last, and it is right that the country creating this modern type of locomotion should maintain it.

DIVISION AND DEATH

As we watch the inevitable results of the human but cowardly "Peace of Munich," we realize that it was not peace, but a sword of division and death. A brave little democracy that had been a model to the world, and with more approval to its sympathies than Spain had.

INTERSTATE TRADE TROUBLES

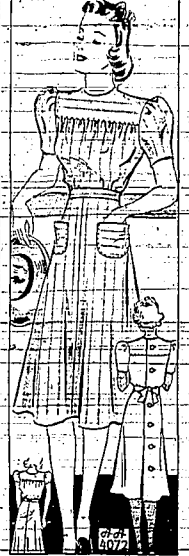

Statisticians Seek Cause Of Recent Divorce Wave

NEW YORK, March 21—Divorces in the United States showed a heavy increase as an aftermath of the World war, according to a study by statisticians for the first time during the past few years following 1929 and, for some unexplained reason, took a sharp turn upwards in 1937 and 1938.

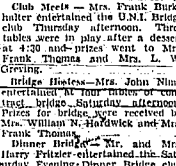

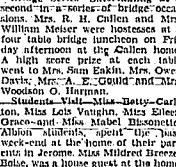

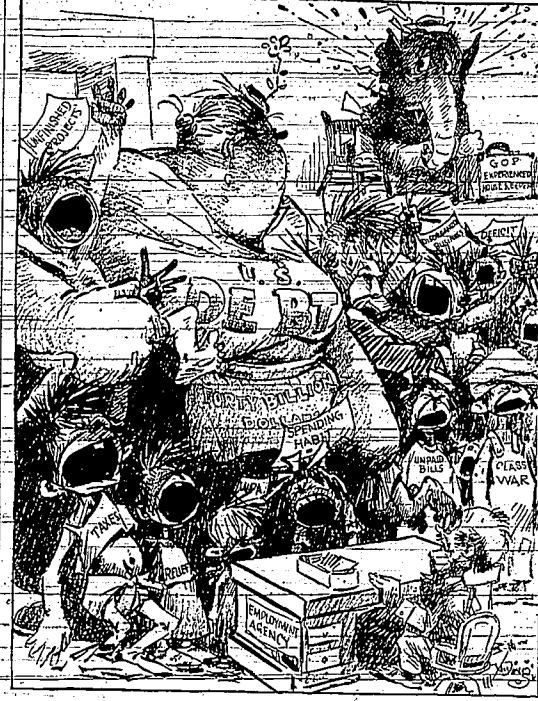

SLASH SIGHTED IN RELIEF ROLL

State Director Says 150 WPA Workers in County May Lose Jobs

Approximately 150 heads of families employed on WPA projects in Twin Falls county will be relieved from their jobs during the work reduction April 1 unless congressional appropriations \$150,000,000 additional funds now being considered in Washington. H. E. Fobes, state director of operations for WPA, said in Twin Falls yesterday.

Fobes said that, unless the WPA had been ordered by Washington to make immediate preparations for the reduction unless additional funds were to be available. The Idaho quota will be slashed by 1725 persons to a low of 475.

Reductions in this amount will be made on project basis and will include supervisory workers in addition to the relief workers on projects.

Eight hundred and seven workers were employed on Twin Falls county WPA projects at the end of the year on the basis of state reductions, about 15 per cent will be taken from projects.

Estimated total county WPA projects will be similarly reduced under present orders.

Estimated total Twin Falls county WPA workers had been earning approximately \$45,000 per month during the winter.

Some projects now working will be reduced in personnel and other projects now in operation may be discontinued entirely unless Congress makes the needed money available. Fobes declared he is advising some engineers and project sponsors to confer on the ordered reductions. It will also be necessary to advise sponsors that opening of new projects may be influenced by this action. The same criteria are being used to all WPA zones in Idaho.

The director of the work program was re-elected to southern Idaho on a list of projects. He is expected to discuss reductions of quotas. He was accompanied by Horace N. Fobes, supervisor of public relations for the Idaho WPA.

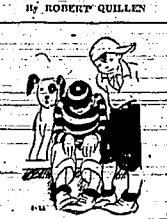

IDAHOAN SEES OUTLAW ESCAPE

Jerome Minister on Visit at Cody Witness to Sensational Jailbreak

JEROME, March 21.—The Rev. W. P. Willis, Jerome Presbyterian pastor, who was called to his former parish at Cody, Wyo., last week because of the death of a friend of the family, was an eyewitness to the sensational jail break at Earl Durand, convicted Maine pooper, who had been sentenced to serve six months in the state penitentiary at Cody.

Mr. Willis was visiting Rev. Lyman Winkle, Cody Presbyterian minister, whose residence is opposite the jail. The two ministers had been inspecting a new chapel built here when they were notified that the convict had escaped.

They notified police authorities by phone, and as the prisoner and his partner drove away Mr. Willis went to the court house to see what had happened. There he found three other prisoners at liberty but apparently too frightened to move.

They declared Durand had framed one of the other prisoners with a small bottle, taking his pistol and forcing him across the alley to the street. There the rifle was secured and the pair headed east toward Pocatello.

About an hour later Mr. Willis and the jailing party were here to board a train for home on the way their car was stopped by Carbon county Montana officers who rounded their car and informed them that Under Sheriff D. W. Tucker had been killed, and Town Marshal Charles E. Lewis fatally wounded.

The last prisoner was well acquainted with the slain officers and had shared Red Cross administration duties with Baker during the depression.

Members of the Charles Lewis family were members of the Powell Presbyterian church. Rev. Willis had visited Mrs. Lewis the day before the killing had occurred. Under Sheriff Noah Riley was for a time superintendent of the Carbon county jail at the Cody, Presbyterian church.

It is the opinion of the acquaintance that Earl Durand, who lived in the neighborhood and often was away from home for months, having been in the neighborhood in the open or in caves, was driven to desperation by the thought of spending six months in a small cell. Mr. Willis said it is quite possible that the murderer will evade capture for many months, he declared.
