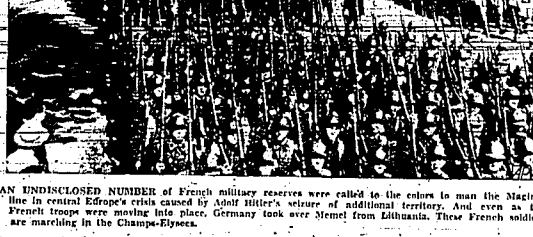

BOISE, March 23.—Constitutionality of certain provisions of the 1937 law creating the office of state comptroller was questioned today by Attorney General W. Taylor in an opinion requested by State Auditor Calvin Wright.

"It is my opinion that Senate Bill 67, insofar as it attempts to transfer any constitutional powers and duties from the office of the state auditor, is unconstitutional," Taylor wrote.

Republican administration forces sponsored the bill in the state legislature and Governor C. A. Bolin recently appointed former State Senator Donald Wright as auditor to assume the post April 1.

"The fundamental question involved is whether such powers can be transferred from the constitutional office of auditor to an official not so designated," Taylor wrote.

"Chapter 7 of the 1937 statutes, the law in force at the time of the adoption of the constitution, lists the powers and duties of the state auditor, or comptroller, as he was then called. The law vests in the powers vested by the constitution in the office of state auditor, and without the aid of any other authorities which have been conferred, it is concluded that powers which are not so conferred cannot be transferred to another office," Taylor wrote.

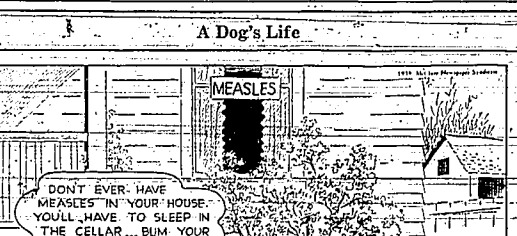
