TAXI-INSURANCE QUESTION-RAISED

Attorney Reports Difficulty in Obtaining Policies at Council Meeting

Twin Falls taxicab companies will have to seek insurance whether or not they can secure public liability and property damage insurance under a proposed city ordinance regulating taxicab companies.

The city council passed the ordinance at its first meeting last night, but the ordinance must be read and passed two more times before becoming effective.

Third and final reading was set for Monday April 3, at 8 o'clock. At that time, the ordinance will be in effect one month later under provisions of the act.

Points to obstacle in the ordinance placing the date of final action was the fact that some of the firms might be unable to secure liability and property insurance.

It is very difficult to secure liability insurance for taxicab companies. If these firms are unable to secure insurance, the ordinance cannot be enforced.

Members of the city council have expressed their opinion that the ordinance is a necessary one.




