

Leader of Italians in Tunisia Awaits Signal

Mussolini Can Count on 'Little Duce' In Africa

TUNIS, Tunisia.—(Correspondent of THE NEWS)—Mussolini sent a note to war against France in Africa as a sequel to the current Russo-French "racket" over the "Koraid-Henstein"—"Little Duce"—to help him.

Against him will be arrayed a number of Italian refugees and camp cavalry.

Tunisia's "French" protectorate has figured prominently in the Fascist campaign here, which is a campaign born of Italy's desire for greater influence in the Mediterranean. In Tunisia itself Italy appears to be the strongest power, with thousands of Italians living here.

The presence of a "Koraid-Henstein" and a "free corps," made up of three thousand ex-members of the Sudetenland Germany won from Czechoslovakia in the European crisis last fall, has been a factor.

Their leader, Konrad Henlein, was the leader of the Germans of Czechoslovakia who cooperated with Hitler in his march into the Sudetenland. Italy's counterpart is handsome Enrico Santa-Maria Leads Italians

Santa-Maria, 40, son of "Little Duce" at Rome, Santamaria is director of "L'Unione," Facolt newspaper of Tunis. Marion Davies, known for her stage role in the silent film "The Cheat" in 1915, had been ill for two years.


In 1919 she appeared in "The Cheat" in a production of Charles Dillingham, and "The Sheik," among them.


