SOUTH IDAHO GETS LOWER FREIGHT RATE

Union Pacific Special Agent Announces Reduced and Simplified Structure for Shipments to Coast

John Johnson, Idaho general agent of the Union Pacific railroad, said in a message to the Board of Trade that the railroad will establish a reduced and simplified rate structure from south Idaho and eastern Oregon producing areas to California and the Pacific Northwest.

Rate reductions range from two to 10 cents per hundred pounds, depending on commodities and origins in southern Idaho and eastern Oregon, he said. They will be effective soon.

Johnson said the adjustment provides blanket rates from points east of Helena, Mont., to Los Angeles and San Francisco and Los Angeles area destinations as follows: From Boise to Los Angeles, 40 cents per hundred pounds; from Boise to San Francisco, 45 cents per hundred pounds; from Boise to Los Angeles and San Francisco, 45 cents per hundred pounds.

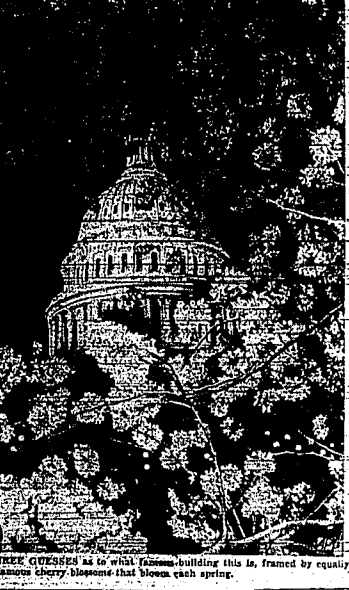

McNUTT'S PLANS CLAIM ATTENTION

'Mail Order' Campaign for Nomination May Lead to Personal Drive

WASHINGTON, April 1 (AP)—A hint that former governor Paul V. McNutt of Indiana will be the "first aspirant" for a 1940 presidential nomination to take the field in person has caught Washington political attention.

It came in the form of an announcement by McNutt boomers in Indiana that a "mail order" campaign had been initiated in his name. Reports have since been current that the present high commissioner to the Philippines would return to the United States this coming summer to take over direct management of the efforts of his party in the 1940 presidential nomination.

The "mail order" plan is circulating among Democratic state leaders of letters calling attention to McNutt as a "comparable" candidate behind whom pro and anti New Deal Democrats could rally.

Speaking Invitations

No Hints Given
Reports were then current that McNutt had hopes had been touched upon in his conversations with President Roosevelt. Neither McNutt nor McNutt's name may have passed between them in that connection. There was no hint of any commitment or hint from the President as to his own 1940 intentions.

Development in subsequent months have changed the political situation, however, to make room for the McNutt boom at this time a significant circumstance. Democratic defeats in gubernatorial races last November have thinned the ranks of 1940 favorite son candidates, particularly in the midwest. That has potentially improved McNutt's chance of picking up party support in the midwest and in other states with no favorite son material of their own.

Some political analysts here consider it conceivable that the president, whatever his own 1940 attitude may be, might welcome active delegate-seeking at this stage by McNutt or any other Democrat to offset the Garner drive with its anti-New Deal implications.

Fatal Accident Puts Out Lights

SAN DIEGO, Cal., April 1 (AP)—Two power-company employees were burned to death and "most" of San Diego was without electricity for an hour after a 22,000-volt switch at the Consolidated Gas and Electric company power house short-circuited yesterday.

Harold M. Dofus, 30-year-old electrician, and Edwin J. Cook, 30, helper, died later from burns after George Courser, assistant fire chief, rescued him from the switch gallery, enveloped in flames after the short-circuit. Courser needed hospital attention.

For an hour after the short-circuit the city was virtually paralyzed as street cars, traffic signals, police radio, and other facilities using "the current" halted. Current was brought in from outside power companies and the power plant here went into service gradually as units in the switching system were restored.

Historic Church Plans Memorial

WASHINGTON, April 1 (AP)—Worshippers at the famed "Church of Presidents" hope to create a unique memorial in this monument-studded town to the father of the constitution.

To honor the memory of James Madison, who offered in the debate the "bill of rights" guaranteeing religious freedom as the first amendment to the constitution, they would set aside a free park in tiny St. John's Episcopal church for public use.

"As in many historic churches of the east, most news of St. John's are held by prominent families who pay poor rental."

The memorial movement started after the St. John's-Mora clubbing by Justice Roberts of the supreme court noted the Madison's birthday (March 16) "passed unnoticed" and that only a stained glass window in the church now commemorates the fourth president in the capital.

Although eighty presidents have been members of St. John's congregation, and five others worshiped there, Madison is conspicuously lacking in the little brick stone structure that stands across the street from the White House.

Tradition has it that a road accident suffered by the Madisons prompted the movement to build a church in the barren White House neighborhood of early Washington.

When Madison was president in 1809, the only churches in Washington were St. John's Episcopal and Catholic churches four miles away, beyond the capital.

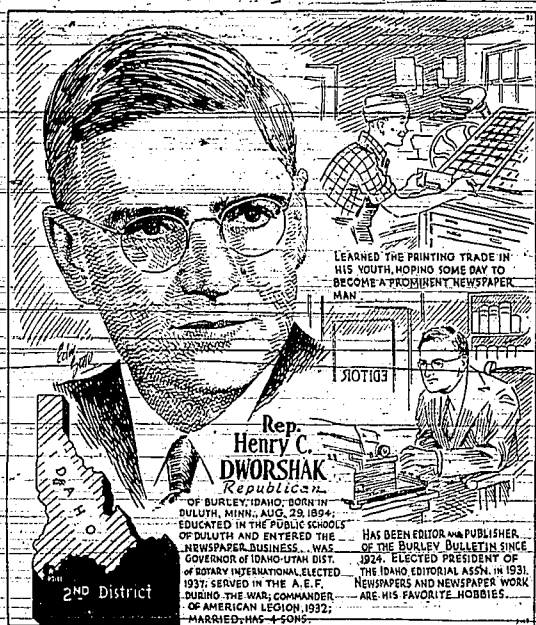

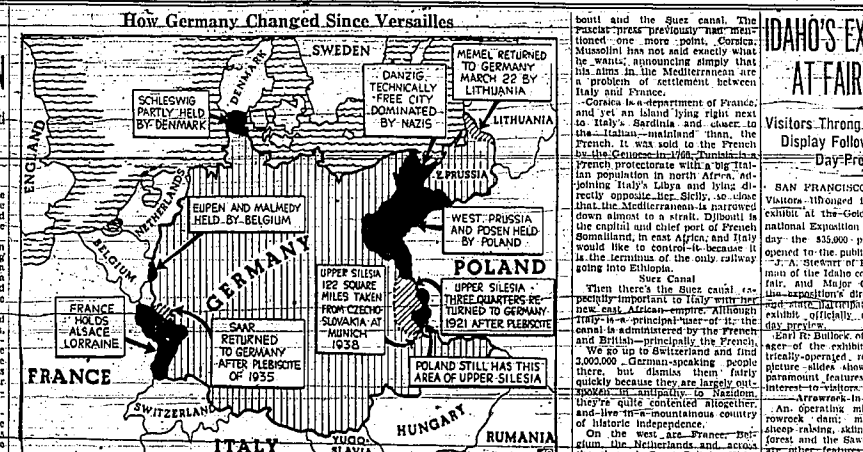

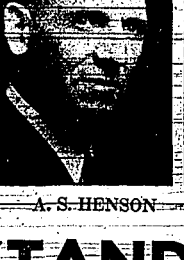
