L.D.S. CHURCH ASKS FASTING TO AID NEEDY

Religious Authorities Urge
750,000 Faithful Mormons
To Go Hungry Twice-Each-
Month in Relief Drive

SALT LAKE CITY, April 8 (AP)—Latter Day Saints church authorities, as a result of 750,000 faithful Mormons today to go hungry twice each month that the church might care for its needy members.

A fast program, inaugurated last year as a one-month-a-month drive, has intensified the twice-monthly fast by 2,000 Mormon leaders studied the 1939 needs of their unemployed.

The original program, through which members donated money to the poor, the sick and the most destitute, had forgone, netted \$43,172 in cash in 1938, but war projects and food for unemployed cost "the church a great deal."

Hold Secret Meeting

As leaders studied their relief problem, priests of the church, including the president and white-robed chief of the Mormon temple to hold a secret meeting—the first of its kind in the temple's history.

It will return tomorrow to the turtle-backed tabernacle for the final sessions of their 10th annual conference.

President George Albert Grant and his counselors—President Clark and David O. McKay expected to give the church's attitude on the fast.


Authorities expressed implicit confidence that the aims of the church welfare program, through which members of federal relief rolls and make them self-sufficient could be right if the people cannot accept it.

Self-Support Is Aim

Harold E. Lee, managing director of the church program, said that the ultimate aim is to make needy members of the church self-supporting, not merely provide relief.

"The central storehouse is a crutch to lean upon until dependence can be made independent," he said.

Lee pointed to the work of the church last year in which it gave employment to 4,240 persons and received contributions from 1,000 needling jobs; 7,700 on January 1, 1938; the general committee added 56,472 persons in all.

EMERGENCY FREIGHT RATE TO CONTINUE



Chamberlain Breaks Easter Holiday to Speed Anti-Aggression Bloc; Eyes Now on Hitler

(By The Associated Press)

Benito Mussolini's modern Roman empire assumed domination over ancient, Moslem-Albania Saturday—in a Holy week conquest that sent a fresh wave of war fright over the Western world.

The unexpected Fascist coup in the tiny kingdom which only weeks ago seemed to be a safe, picturesque ward of Europe appeared suddenly to sign that the Rome-Berlin axis was on the march toward bigger things.

Official quarters in Washington feared another European war crisis this week. The United States condemned the action.

Alarmed by the swift Italian invasion, Britain and France hurried to get their troops into position. France sent 100,000 men to the Balkans, and Britain sent 100,000 to the Mediterranean. Italy's ally, Portugal, sent 10,000 to Spain.

Germany told Poland to stand by, and Hitler's Foreign Minister, Joachim von Ribbentrop, said he would not let the Italian invasion go unanswered.

Japan, too, sent 10,000 men to the Balkans, and the Soviet Union sent 10,000 to the Black Sea. France and Britain sent 100,000 to the Balkans, and the Soviet Union sent 100,000 to the Black Sea.

There were hopes that a crisis would not develop, but the British government said that the Italian invasion was a clear violation of the League of Nations' principles.

THREE VIEWS OF NEW IDAHO LAWS

Attorney General Takes Leading Role in Dispute Over Validity

Boise.—A lot of the biggest legal controversy over validity of new Idaho legislation is rising again in Boise.

Under Scrutiny—Over three-quarters of bills—range from expressions of condemnation over such goings-on in commendation for those responsible.

The rise in recent years of three schools of thought in the matter of law-making—now throws some light on the matter.

Democrats of each school have been almost equally outspoken.

Three Schools—First, there are those who deplore the cutting of legal corners and advocate strict adherence to the letter of the law, regardless of the legislative intent of the act called "law's delay."

Second, there are those who end their lives in the belief that it is entirely right-cut corners, even though red-tape in the interests of efficiency and economy.

Third, there are those who believe in strict honesty, they do not mind cutting corners honestly, they do not mind for strenuous adherence to the letter of the law, but they would prefer that whatever is done be done without publicity.

In the past eight years there had been a great increase in the duties of the attorney general of the state.

Att. Gen.'s Policy—Ex-Attorney General Bert E. Miller—announced many times it was the duty of his department to see that the law was observed and that his office would defend the state right or wrong.

When he was succeeded two years ago by Attorney General Fred A. Taylor former Twin Falls County prosecuting attorney—the idea was continued.

Not only that, the courts ruled that the attorney general is superior to any prosecuting attorney in any county—and can direct those officials to do what he wants them to do that wasn't too clear before the courts ruled.

In the course of a month many instances were reported to the attorney general.

In instances where the state supreme court had not clearly defined its authority, Taylor would admit that his office is composed of lawyers and does not always decide cases the way people think they should be decided.

Attorney Rules—Capital offenders point to one interesting example in the matter of law observance:

About 20 years ago a legislature in Old Idaho, for example, that the state could dispose of certain equipment, and then obtain new equipment.

Friday to sundown Saturday was "that" and prepare the body for permanent burial.

They layed the body on the first day of the week at sunset to burial the body for burial. As they approached their tomb, the question came to them, "How shall we move the stone?"

But when they got there, they looked and behold, the stone was moved.

Sister still there, three of them, a man sitting in the sepulchre, wearing a white robe, and he said to them, "This is the 'stone' in our oldest Gospel." And when they heard him say that, they believed.

And she said, "Sir, if you have taken him away, tell me where you have laid him." And he turned and faced her, "Mary." And she turned and faced him, and cried out, "Habbon-Matthe!"

She went to bear the joyful news, "I have seen the Lord."

And many another, from that day to this has "seen the Lord," not dying only, but risen and victorious. And in that vision of Jesus they have found life and peace.


