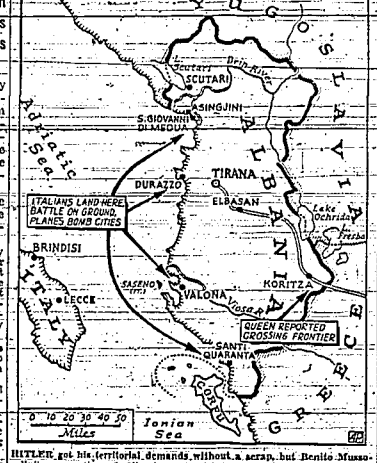

Fishing Season to Open Memorial Day

Commission Rejects Legion Appeal to Change Date

BOISE, April 8 (AP)—There will be legal fishing in Idaho on Memorial day.

The state fish and game commission declined today to change the season's opening from Memorial day, May 30, despite an appeal by officials of the Idaho department of the Idaho Legion.

The latter urged the change on grounds the day should be devoted to services honoring the nation's war dead.

The commission didn't think it advisable at this time to make any change in view of the fact that licenses are already printed with May 30 listed as the opening date, said George Booth of Boise, commission chairman.

"We felt that there was not time to properly advertise the change, if it had been made."

"We will give the matter further consideration and might make the change for next year."

Booth said the commission voted to favor establishment in Idaho of a cooperative wildlife investigative unit which would be financed jointly by the commission, the American Wildlife Institute, the biological survey and the state university involved.

Officials of the University of Idaho at Moscow and the University of Idaho southern branch at Pocatello have offered their facilities for the project, Booth said.

A new unit is to be established either in Montana, Idaho or Washington, and it is hoped that this action by the Idaho commission will bring it to Idaho.

Outfielder Ace Joins Chicago's Crippled Shortstop

Outfielder—Ace Galan, team officials disclosed, has been ordered home from his spring training trip for treatment of an injured left knee. He will join Dick Bartell, star shortstop, in the hospital immediately after his arrival. It is not likely that either player will be in the lineup when the Cubs open defense of their National League title a week from Tuesday.

A week ago today, M.A. R.A. O'Connell, Bartell, star shortstop, was struck in the head by a pitch which has troubled him since March 12. Yesterday, Dr. John F. Davis, of the Cubs, said Bartell faces an indefinite stay in the hospital. Some observers believe the former New York Giant star will be ready for action ahead of Galan.

The speedy outfielder, who has been playing brilliantly and was counted on to spark the Cub out-field defense, may have to undergo an operation for a torn cartilage. He was out of 40 games before September last season, hurt the knee again in a series with Pittsburgh, and was unable to play regularly in the world series.

Galan's place in left field is expected to be filled by Jim Green, coach by the Cubs from the New York Yankees Newark club last fall.
