

COMMISSION BEGINS TOLL BRIDGE STUDY

Engineer Discusses Features And Condition of Interstate County Span; Law Authorizing Purchase Examined

(By The Associated Press)
BOISE, April 10.—The Idaho State Commission on Intercounty bridge commission met here today for its first session to lay preliminary plans for negotiations with the owners looking toward purchase of the span, which is Idaho's only toll bridge.

The commission was authorized by the 1939 legislature to spend up to \$500,000 in treasury funds to buy the bridge and remove the amounting to \$75,000 annual.

A tenth-of-a-cent-a-gallon tax was imposed on gasoline and oil products to raise funds to retire the notes.
