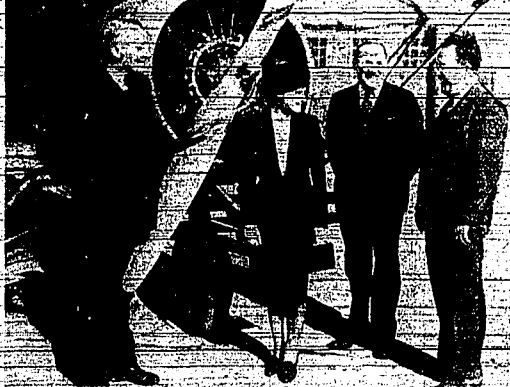

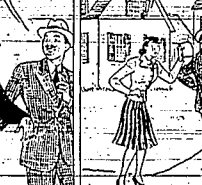

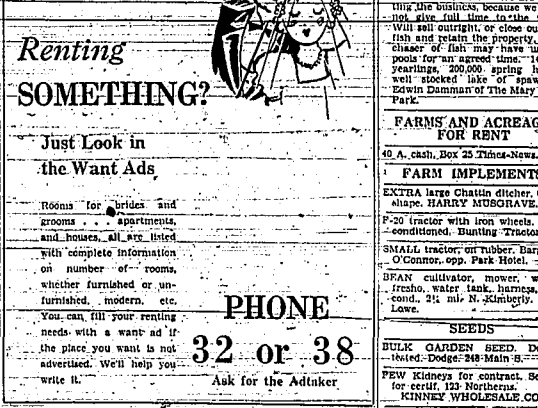

# AAA ANNOUNCES RULES FOR FLAX

## Provisions Permit Growing Without Penalization on Payments

Flax in Twin Falls county may now be grown without penalization, providing the usual provisions of the 1939 AAA program, according to announcement made recently by Harry L. Stafford, state AAA executive officer.

"In Twin Falls county, farmers meet with the provisions, their acreage will have no effect on the amount of their soil conservation payment," Mr. W. Lincoln, secretary of the Agricultural Conservation Association, said this week.

"While the committee has recognized that flax is definitely a soil-depleting crop, it also is a 'deficiency' crop — one for which the demand far exceeds the supply, both for all and for flax, in this county," Lincoln said.

"As a result, the program provides for the growing of this profitable crop and will consider it as depleting so far as 1939 crop classification is concerned.

The provisions are as follows: 1. That it be planted — not grown — with an established stand of legumes or grasses. This is applicable to the entire state.

2. That it be planted as a nurse crop to an established stand of legumes or grasses. This is applicable to all counties north of the Salmon river and irrigated lands of southern Idaho.

3. Where practical, that it be followed in 1939 after the harvest, with an established stand of legumes or grasses on the same acreage. This is applicable to irrigated lands only.

"The state committee has emphasized that the accompanying stand of legumes and grasses must be good enough to be considered 'established' and will be judged accordingly, and will be counted against the soil-depleting allotments and the conservation provisions," Lincoln pointed out.

"The show-cause order was set for Monday afternoon at 2 o'clock, striking bus drivers charged, charged."

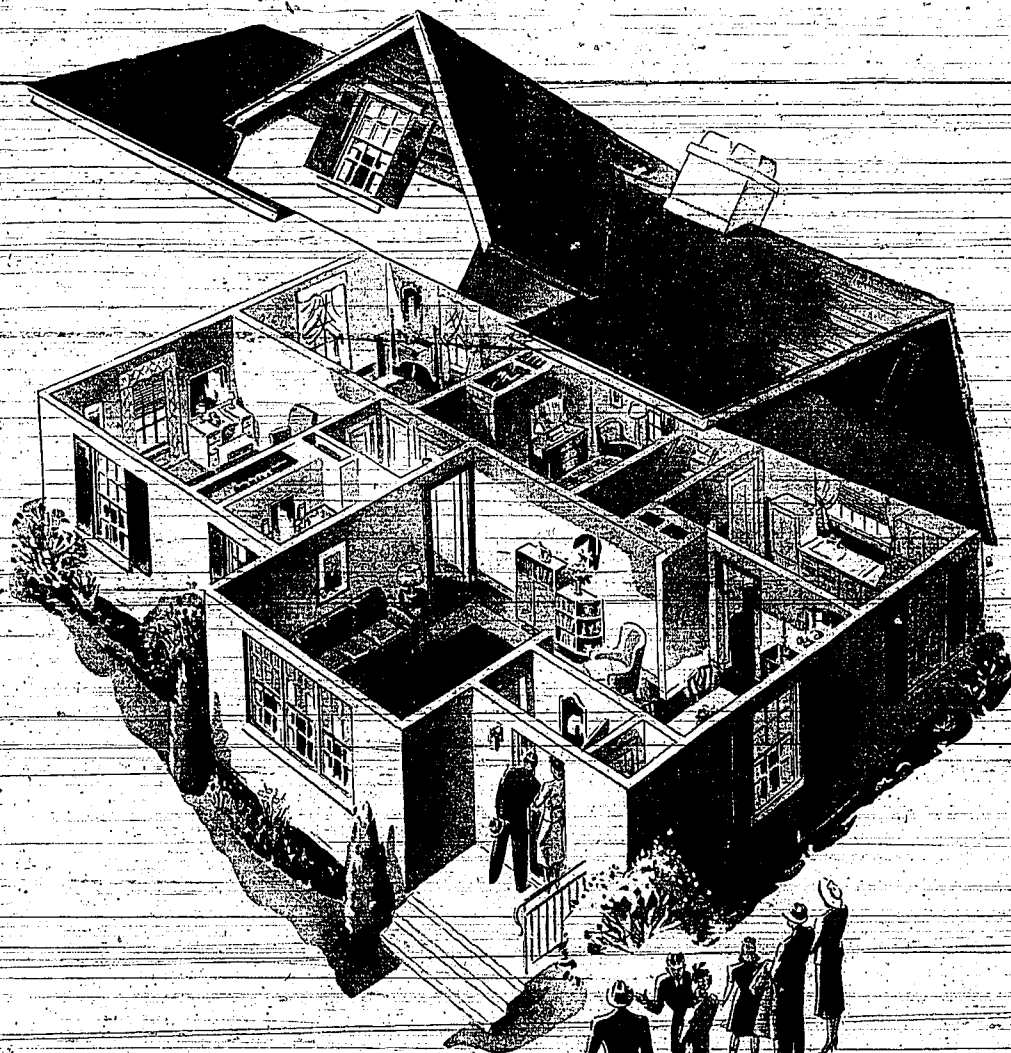

In competition with hundreds of houses throughout the United States, the home of Mr. and Mrs. John S. Feldhusen, located four miles east of Twin Falls, won a thousand dollar prize in the National Building Contest sponsored by the General Electric Company's National "New American Home Building Contest." The Feldhusen home was one of twenty grand prize winners, two of which were in the Rocky Mountain division.

The contest was judged on a 10-point basis that included construction, location, financing and electrification. Both new and remodeled homes were eligible.

The Feldhusen home is unique in that it was built in two operations, one in 1924 and the other in 1928. ### A. A. A. Boosts Farm Gardens

To encourage larger vegetable garden farms, the Agricultural Adjustment Administration of the U. S. Department of Agriculture has made an important change in the regulations governing soil-depleting crops.

Officials of the department have approved the following statement as a correct description of the status of home gardens on the farm.

In the 1932 Agricultural Conservation Programme of the Department of Agriculture, home gardens on the farm are encouraged by being specifically exempted from the soil-depleting crops.

This means a good deal to the farmer. In the past, if he grew a crop of "soil-depleting" crops, he would be required to allow for soil depleting crops—the cash crop. In other words, upon which he depended for cash income.

Now he can make his garden without including it in his allowance and thus he is able to devote his entire soil-depleting acreage allowance to his cash crop. This will increase his garden acreage.

In money value this means a substantial gain, and the new ruling should result in a great increase in farm gardens.

Officials state that the crops which the farmer can grow in his garden are: corn, sorghum, soybeans, beans, peas, and annual and perennial vegetables which are raised on the farm. Cattle feeding is included so long as they are eaten by the home folks and not sold.

The actual cash value of this new ruling will vary so much in different localities that no figure can be given, but to the farmer who makes a good size home garden it will mean a substantial amount.

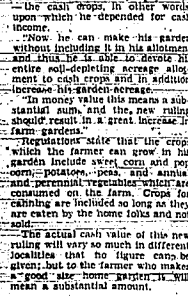

Certain vital factors should be present to provide reasonable assurance that "garden homes" will be preserved over a period of years. Federal Housing Administration officials point out:

- Essential Factors**
- Among the factors which are considered essential to the ultimate success of garden-home development are: (1) A community should be developed in which the land is not so expensive as to permit developing the size of plot at a price within the means of the average family. (2) The site should have all characteristics which will permit intensive cultivation of an adequate vegetable and fruit supply must be available, and electricity is desirable. Streets should be adequate to serve the area.
- Location Important**
- (3) It must be so located as to be accessible to well-developed shopping, factory and industrial areas capable of providing steady employment for the neighborhood. (4) Transportation at a low cost should be available. (5) Schools, shopping, and recreational centers should be available within the tract or in the immediate neighborhood. (6) Low taxes are essential, together with a likelihood that assessments for the plot be levied in the neighborhood to which the property is transferred. (7) The streets to which such properties are sold must definitely possess all the characteristics of a well-located residential street. (8) A maintained control of the land and zoning regulations should be provided or allowed. (9) The dispersion of industry into the working areas of the community, centers, as well as the growth and development of the arterial and highway systems, must be such as to make the garden-home type of development much more feasible than in the past.

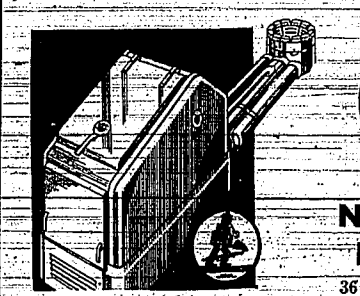

### CAUTION CHECKS DANGER OF FIRE

#### Federal Housing Administration Gives Suggestions For Prevention

A few simple precautions taken by home owners will materially reduce the danger of fire in his dwelling, according to the technical division of the Federal Housing Administration.

The primary causes of fire losses in homes are: (1) defective wiring, careless handling of matches and cigarettes, and spontaneous combustion.

Caution may be exercised over the first cause by never allowing a furnace fire to stay too hot for a long period, and by examining flues and chimneys before putting the furnace into duty for the winter.

The chances of fire breaking out from defective wiring can be minimized by seeing that there is no overloading and that cords of all accessories are in good condition.

The third cause mentioned is altogether controllable by the exercise of ordinary care. Matches should not be left burning in ash trays, and matches should not be thrown in waste baskets and stoves. Spontaneous combustion of the matter of spontaneous combustion is controllable when its cause is understood. Only rag or rags used in painting, newspapers and old magazines stored in unventilated closets, oil cans, and old tins in tiny broom closets, all of these and many other materials may produce spontaneous combustion, and should be guarded against. All flammable materials should be thrown away or destroyed and not allowed to accumulate within the home.

### Home Mortgages on Sounder, Safer Basis

#### Volume of Funds Invested Over Nation Increases During Past Year

WASHINGTON, D. C.—The volume of funds invested in home mortgages over the nation increased in 1938 over the previous year, according to a report issued by the Federal Home Loan Bank board today.

This increase, from \$17,300,000,000 in 1937 to \$17,600,000,000 in 1938, marks an encouraging turning point in one phase of the nation's economic life, the board pointed out. The principal reason for welcoming the upward trend in home purchases and home construction is the fact that the home mortgage debt of the country today is unquestionably on a much sounder and safer basis than any time in recent history.

The leveling off of property values from their peak in 1929 during the so-called boom days, and the widespread substitution of the long-term amortized loan for the dangerous short-term loan has greatly altered the situation, said Mr. J. C. McDonald, Federal Housing Administration director.

The report of the Federal Home Loan Bank board is based on data from 1921 to the present. It shows that the volume of funds invested in home mortgages has increased steadily and has brought greater stability to the investment market, while public insurance has also been strengthened by the greater disappearance of the old amortized term note with its high interest rate, and second and third mortgages with their high interest rates and low insurance.

Authorities estimate that there are now about 30 million all-secured mortgages in use in the United States. One of the most commonly used is the so-called "level-payment" type of which is now being used to equivalent to about four cents of the principal. This type of mortgage is manufactured in many different patterns.

### EFFICIENCY HIGH IN SMALL HOME

#### Construction of Low-Priced Houses Calls for Careful Planning

Federal Housing Administration officials, citing a definite trend toward construction of smaller, low-priced homes, point out that the small home is not merely a large house compressed and trimmed down.

The principals of plan efficiency, economic use of materials and proper equipment are of chief importance in the design of small, low-priced homes. Donald McDonald, Federal Housing Administration director, says, "Every square foot of floor space must be used to the very length of plan, every pipe connection, every foot of lumber that can be eliminated must be eliminated."

# Insulation Important In Air Conditioning

## Three Types of Material Cut Fuel Cost in Winter and Reduce Summer Heat

Any discussion of air conditioning the old home without consideration of insulation is idle. A Twin Falls authority on the subject says yesterday.

He stated that this applies to central, year-round air conditioning, winter air conditioning without provision for summer cooling, or summer cooling along with the room cooler method or by air conditioning.

Insulation is the first condition for some form of automatic control of temperature and humidity conditions. Insulation is in itself a form of air conditioning.

### Cuts Fuel Consumption

In winter it prevents heat seepage through the walls and the roof of the house and is instrumental in cutting fuel costs from 20 to 40 per cent according to reliable estimates.

In the summer, likewise, insulation tends to reduce summer heat by preventing or cutting down substantially the seepage of outside heat through the walls and ceiling into the interior of the house.

Interior temperatures through the use of insulation may be 10 to 15 degrees lower in the summer than those prevailing outdoors.

Insulation also tends to create a more uniform, stable air condition within the house which with the addition of some artificial means of heating, cooling, humidifying or dehumidifying, means that control of the air conditions doubly possible, efficient and considerably more economical.

Obviously, it is more difficult to add insulation to an existing building than it is to do the job at the time of construction.

And the manufacturers of insulating material have been insulating their approach to insulating the old home.

### Three Types

Three common types of insulation are employed—the rigid type which consists of pre-fabricated boards of one-half to one-inch thickness, mineral wool, bats which may be installed in wall spaces and the loose type of mineral wool which is manufactured in a molten form—used for filling wall spaces through a pneumatic tube under pressure; and blankets of vegetable fiber and other materials.

The roof of the house is the most important from an insulating standpoint because it has the greatest surface area of the sun is felt most during summer months and because in the winter it is the best heat in the house and an insulated roof allows much of the heat to be retained in the house and to be used for fuel consumption.

Fortunately, in the old house, the roof is the easiest place to get at from an insulating standpoint, the Twin Falls expert declared.

Most old houses have an unfinished attic. Just insulation may be nailed over the studs, batts of mineral wool cut to the exact width may be inserted between them, or a combination of the two employed.

In the latter case, the insulation may be nailed over the studs and rock wool applied in the wall spaces. The floor of the attic may be treated in the same manner.

Investigate insulation if you intend to remodel that old house.

### Morning Sunlight For Dining Room

If plans for a new home include provisions for a dining room, a number of factors should be taken into consideration, according to government officials.

Southeast exposure is desirable in order to assure morning sunlight in a dining room. If a different south exposure is considered, the following considerations are: (1) The room should be planned with ample wall space to accommodate the furniture; (2) immediate access from kitchen or pantry is essential; (3) smaller dining space planned in conjunction with the living room is generally satisfactory for normal family use and permits flexibility for special occasions.

### Nursery Annex Provides Space

One of the most important rooms for a home for a family with children is the nursery. It should be light, airy, and designed so that it may be kept clean and sanitary at all times.

A sleeping porch annex to a nursery will increase greatly the health-promoting features, as well as create welcome additional space. Such an addition should be plainly finished, electrically decorated, with done-in-light pastel paint or paper, woodwork painted deep cream, and a composition floor insulating natural wood plankings make an effective and efficient combination.

Wall-bracket lighting fixtures with shades will eliminate glare and make the atmosphere more airy. Plenty of closet space and built-in shelves for storing playthings and nursery equipment are highly desirable.

# HOME-BUYING AND BUILDING EXPAND

## Loans Advanced by Associations Increased Nearly Five Per Cent

WASHINGTON, D. C.—An analysis by officials of the Federal Home Loan Bank board of virtually all factors reflecting home building and financing indicated today that home building and home financing are being steadily expanded.

Reports from all parts of the United States to the Federal Division of Research and Statistics included the following highlights:

1. Loans advanced by all savings and loan associations in February 1939 were \$3,000,000 more than in January, an increase of nearly five per cent over January figures. The number of associations during February increased by four per cent in dollar volume and one per cent in number over January, although recordings by other types of mortgage lenders were slightly lower.

2. The number of new family dwelling units in February of this year is estimated to have increased over the same period last year by 123 per cent in February over January and by 11 per cent in February this year over February, 1938.

3. The index of residential construction increased by 123 per cent in February over January and by 11 per cent in February this year over February, 1938.

4. Loans made by all savings and loan associations during February amounted to \$50,500,000 as compared with \$45,500,000 in January, or an increase of 11 per cent. By purpose, the February loans were: construction, \$18,000,000; home purchase, \$19,118,000; refinancing, \$12,520,000; reconditioning, \$8,462,000; other purposes, \$2,400,000.

5. State-chartered members of the Federal Home Loan Bank System accounted for the largest part of the total loans by all savings and loan associations—\$24,100,000. Federally chartered members loaned almost \$20,000,000—\$22,200,000. Non-member associations loaned \$3,400,000.

6. The number of new family dwelling units constructed in February 1939 was reported as 29,278 as compared with 6,493 during the same month in 1938, an increase of 1438.

cooperation with leading life insurance companies and individuals. Mutual savings banks are considered, then savings and loan associations accounted for 85 per cent of the number and 46 per cent of the monetary volume of all home mortgages recorded.

On the basis of these reports, it was estimated that 85,000 mortgages totaling \$220,000,000 were recorded in February, 30 per cent of the number and 46 per cent of the monetary volume of all home mortgages recorded.

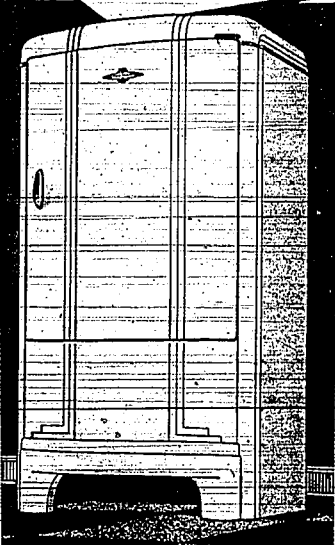
