KANSAS CITY'S MANAGER QUILTS

Eastman, I.C.C. member, declared the railroad themselves were partly responsible for their conditions and saw regulation of all carriers as but one of several needs.

On the other hand, John Jerome Pelley, president of the Associated Railroads, said that the cause of the trouble was the "unequal competition" of other forms of transportation and "unequal treatment" as the single answer. He said that the railroads had no single cause of trouble and that congress was now considering legislation to prevent recurrence of "wastes" of the carriers' money in the purchase of stock of other railroads at exorbitantly high prices; wastes in buying materials at monopolistic prices; and other wastes which have been "checked" by the Interstate Commerce Commission in producing the present condition of railroads.

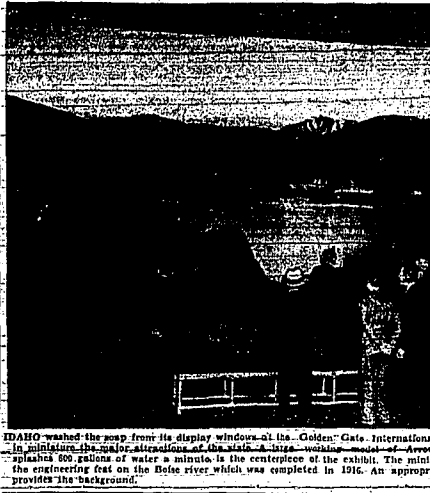
