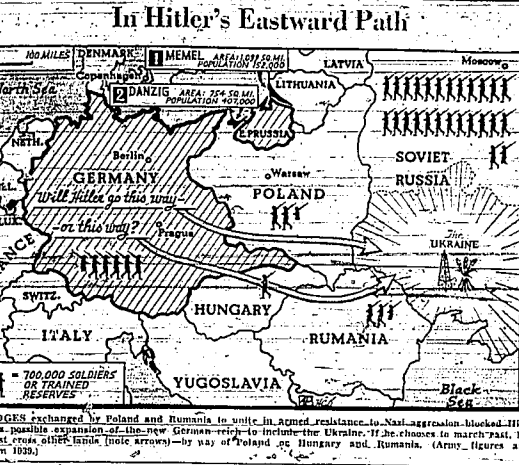

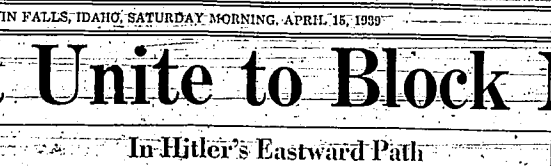

\$59,673,960 - TO IDAHO WORKERS

Social Security Board Reports Average Wage of \$645

WASHINGTON, April 14 (AP)—The social security board reported today wages credited to the old-age insurance accounts of 22,537 Idaho workers in 1937 totaled \$59,673,960, or an average of \$645.

An analysis to facilitate administration of the old-age insurance system, said the report, disclosed 20,157,074 workers accounted for 93.7 percent of the total wages credited in the program the first year of its operation.

Average wages were higher in such industrialized areas as New England, the middle Atlantic states, and the Great Lakes region. Michigan workers had the highest average wage, \$1,102, followed by New York, \$1,049, and Illinois, \$1,022.

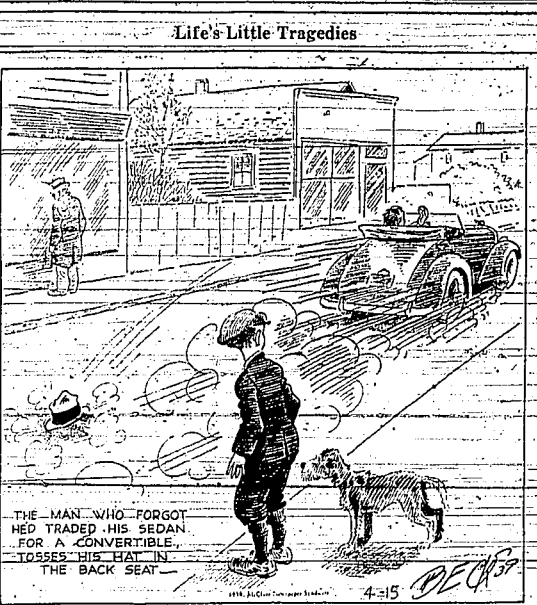
