7 KILLED AS TORNADO HITS WIDE SECTION

Storm Slashes Across Northwest Oklahoma Area; Buildings Smashed and 33 or More Persons Injured

(By The Associated Press) CAPRON, Okla., April 15.—A savage spring tornado

struck again a wide section of northwest Oklahoma today, killing seven, and in this community where nearly every building was smashed not a fourth corner remained.

Starting at Vici, 60 miles to the south, where one was injured fatally, the "twister" boomed on to Capron, 40 miles south of here, then hopped about, killing six persons in farming areas.

Mrs. Beattie Weidell, Waynoka, wife of a Woods county school teacher, was killed in a house in which six Waynoka high school students were caught by the storm near the school.

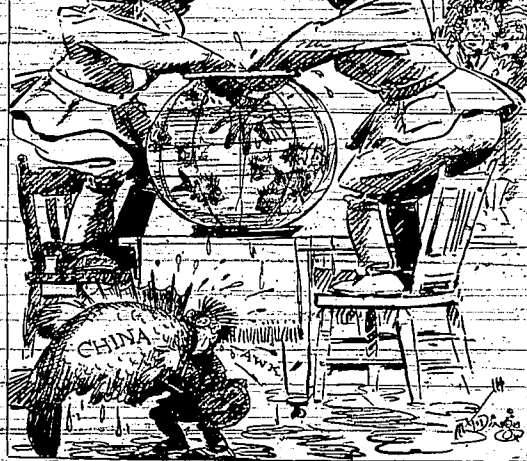

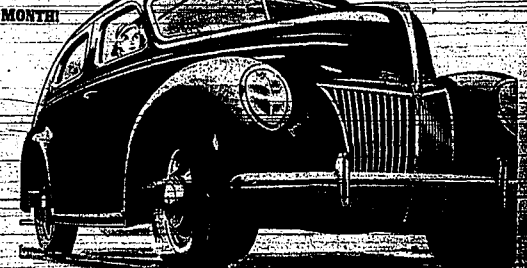

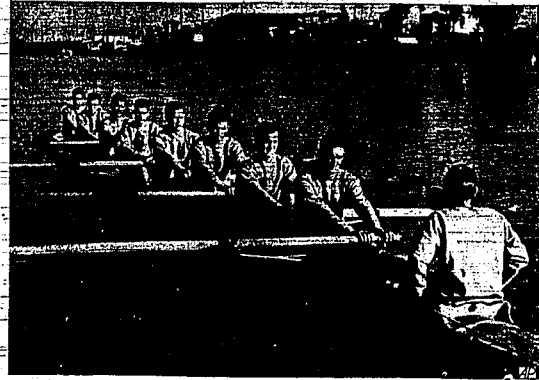
