

CONFESION SOLVES TORSO MURDER CASE

"I Have Nothing to Say, Steelworker Mumbles at Arraignment on Charge of Botchering Woman"
(By The Associated Press)
BALTIMORE, April 20.—Thin-faced Aurelio M. Arco Targinio, steelworker and former tavern-keeper, confessed today he had "botched" the slaying of his housekeeper, 31-year-old Mrs. Evelyn Rippe, known as "Mama".
Earlier, Police Commissioner Robert F. Stanton said Targinio, 45, had confessed slaying Mrs. Rippe, the former Evelyn Neer of Dublin, Ga., and directing her body to the head of which was found in Targinio's rear garden in a shallow brick-lined grave.
"Mama" was the name which the girl had given to her mother, the "mother" Charles W. Wood, who immediately opened an inquest.
The first witness was 12-year-old Mike Nizolek, a neighbor, who identified several articles of clothing found with parts of the body as belonging to Mrs. Rippe.
Police Officer William Ladd, of the series of gruesome discoveries which began when a small boy found her hand, looking for his rubber ball in a sewer last Friday.
The brief inquest ended, the coroner, J. Edgar Targinio, held for grand jury action.
"I have nothing to say," Targinio said he would seek to bring the case before the grand jury tomorrow.
"I am not a lawyer," he said, "and I do not know how to defend myself. I am a poor man and I am afraid of the law."
The day after the grand jury was found, Targinio reported to police officers that he had "botched" the slaying of his housekeeper, as he described it as "a murder."
Police, making a routine check of all mission houses in the neighborhood, Nelson Clark said his police had howled continuously for three days and that he had never seen Mrs. Rippe since Thursday.
Frank M. Peterson said Targinio had been seen and that he had seen Targinio and Mrs. Rippe quarreling near the house on Thursday night and had not seen Mrs. Rippe since.
Targinio was taken into custody and taken to the hospital where he was held overnight, his head, upper arms and hands were bandaged and he was covered with quicklime.
Targinio, leaning over the fence and separated by a wire fence, Targinio, exclaimed as the head was lowered in the hole: "That's Evelyn."

NEW YORK, April 20.—Leaders of the United Mine Workers in Pennsylvania reiterated promises today to supply coal to schools, hospitals, churches and homes of the sick, as the prolonged shutdown of operations in the eight-state Appalachian area brought a progressive reduction in the supply of bituminous coal available to the public.
Here, where for nearly six weeks the delegations of the CIO union and the operators have struggled over a new labor contract, and thus to put the Appalachian into production again, another day's conference ended apparently as fruitlessly as had all the rest.
John R. Blechman, head of the U. S. labor department's coal division, returned to Washington to make a report on the situation to Secretary Perkins.
