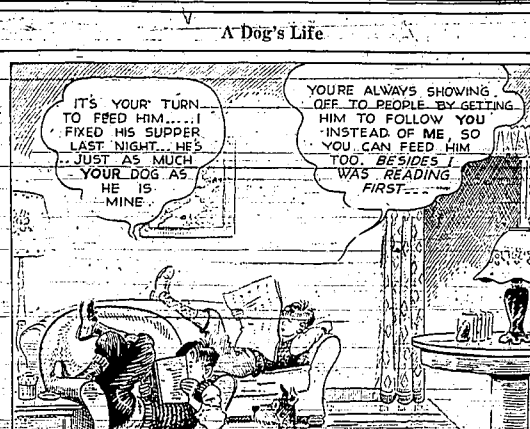
and local welfare units and the wholesale and retail food trades.

Two methods will be tested. Under one, WPA workers may request that an amount of \$5 to \$10 be taken from each member of the family to be deducted from their pay. They will then receive orange-colored stamps of a corresponding amount, which may be used for any food. Blue stamps representing 50 per cent of the value of the orange stamps may also be used for the purchase of an exchange for foods designated as surplus. Thus the consumers will be expected to get and consume more food than usual without additional cost.

Under the other plan, any persons on general relief or receiving old-age assistance, aid-to-dependent children, the blind, and so on, may purchase weekly \$1 to \$1.50 in orange stamps, with which half the amount in blue stamps will be given free. The stamps will be used just as under the first plan.

The whole idea is to get the surplus food to the people who need it but who ordinarily cannot buy it. It should help farmers and many other people alike. It would also help surplus foods without disrupting wholesale and retail operations. It is hoped that it will help all-business.

Anyway, it looks like a better means of reducing food surpluses than that of destroying them.

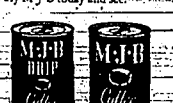

Price of Sugar Trails in U. S.

NEW YORK, April 27.—The lowest of the retail price of sugar in the United States is contrasted with higher prices in other parts of the world in a chart given distributed by Lamson and Company.

The chart presents a display of retail prices of sugar in 42 countries, comparing over an 18-year period the world's consumption of sugar.

In 1921 twenty countries the price of sugar was higher than in the United States which was 5.4 cents per pound, while in only 12 countries the price was lower.

For 16 of the countries the retail price ranged from 8 cents a pound to 17 cents a pound; for 7 countries the range was from 4 cents to 8 cents; for 8 countries it ranged from 5.45 cents to 6 cents; and in 12 countries the range was between 2.5 cents and 5.4 cents.
