RUSSIAN Fliers LAND ON ISLAND

Airmen Forced Down Near Northeastern tip of New Brunswick

NEW YORK, April 29 (AP)—Two Russian aviators who had hoped to fly across the Atlantic non-stop from Moscow to New York tonight after a 4,000-mile non-stop flight from Moscow were compelled to land on lonely Misou island near the northern tip of New Brunswick.

The first word of the flight's end came at 10:45 P. M. (EDT) when

indicated a forced landing.

Liquor, Motor Funds Divided

County's Towns and Highway Districts Share in Apportionments

Twin Falls county's share of 1939 motor vehicle license fees collected at the start of the year totaled \$33,465.40, of which \$2,645.00, or 7.9 percent, was retained by the county. Five highway districts, it was announced at the county auditor's office yesterday, will receive their share.

Twin Falls business districts received \$22,247.28—Buhl, \$6,639.41; Pifer, \$2,029.71; Murtough, \$109.50; and others, \$1,000.

An apportionment of the county's \$3,767.48 share of state liquor taxes for the first quarter also was apportioned yesterday. The amount will be distributed among the county's cities and towns within the county boundaries.

The amount apportioned—the county's general fund was then \$2,870.81; Twin Falls will receive \$1,023.50; Pifer, \$630.41; Buhl, \$221.10; Klimber, \$14,424.00; Hailey, \$40,454.00; and others, \$2,551.

The \$5,787.09 apportionment to the state general fund, including the quarterly \$3,922.80, and leaving the \$2,864.71 apportionment for the first three months of the year, will be distributed under the same tax-base, effective in 1939—records show. Twin Falls county has received \$33,000.32 of state liquor store profits.

Russian Fliers Land on Island

A resident of Atacama Island rushed to the airport to meet the fliers, but the fliers could not understand each other, but he gave them food. An amphibious plane which left Atacama Island on its return flight expected to go to the Chilean coast in the morning.

General Kokubun, who has been based in Chile since 1937, said:

"I am sure they are bound for the Soviet Union, and his navigation made a successful, though short, non-stop flight from Mexico to Chile, and I am sure he will make the same trip, a twin-motored land plane."

In their first post landing report about 10 miles west of St. Lawrence bay, near their eventual landing point, indicating they had spent the night in the water, but from the wet and foggy weather they developed the North Atlantic coast.

Several hundred people had gathered at Finsa Bennett field, expecting them to drop down any moment to the murky low "ceiling."

When the fliers landed safely in the evening, Cumbrany began broadcasting: "We report to you that we have just landed in the water, and we are safe."

It was not immediately ascertainable whether the forced landing was in land or the water, but from the wet and foggy weather it was assumed they were safe.

Their plane, the "Makva" (Makay), had no compass, nor land plane instruments, but it carried an emergency food supply.

Before the takeoff, Kokubun, the Japanese attaché, arranged to establish an air connection between the U.S. S.R. (Russia) and North America.

The plane took a great circuit route over the northwestern part of Europe, Greenland, and the north Atlantic.

The fliers had hoped to link Russia with the United States by plane in 24 hours time.

Cost of the flight was \$14,000.

It required 24 hours and 56 minutes to negotiate the 3,912 miles westward between Berlin and New York.
