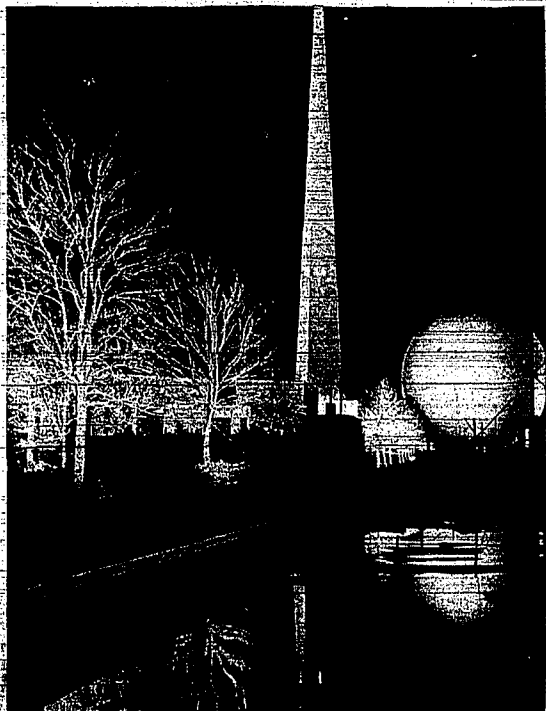


Danzig Looms as Goal of Hitler's Next Move

Warships Feature Opening Of New York World's Fair

THOUSANDS of visitors poured into the Metropolitan Museum of Art today for the opening of the biggest exposition the nation—and the world—has ever seen, the New York World's Fair.

Thousands of visitors poured into town from all parts of the country, the city's traditional throng was noticeably augmented, but flags and bunting, tall hotels and a festive air presaged the debut which, fair officials expect, will draw a million people to the \$160,000,000 international extravaganza.

A hundred newspaper publishers and advertising executives, here this week for the American newspaper publishers' annual convention, were guests of honor at the fair's annual, following the 10th anniversary of the battleship Pennsylvania.

Hundreds of Bluejackets availed themselves of the opportunity to visit the vessels by every type of waterfront ferry.

The next-acting activity was extensive preparations for the visit of President Roosevelt, who will offer a formal luncheon, related tonight at the gateways, where the president will make a short speech to an expected 100,000 special guests in the fair's 'year of peace'.

MILLIGAN TAKES LEGAL SPOTLIGHT

'Country Lawyer' Prosecutes Boss Tom Pedergast Of Kansas City

By HERMAN R. ALLEN KANSAS CITY, April 29.—A man to watch in Kansas City is Maurice M. Milligan, who calls himself "country lawyer" and is trying to get into the city.

Milligan is a United States district attorney. With a flock of convicts under his belt in two of the nation's most sensational cases—the Kansas City union station massacre and the 1936 Iowa fraud—44-year-old Milligan now is ready to prosecute Boss Tom Pedergast, head of the dominant Kansas City Democratic organization, on charges of income tax evasion.

He also will prosecute Charles F. Carroll, called by Federal Judge Albert L. Reeves "the big man" in Kansas City gambling, and 23 persons indicted as members of a national-wide \$1,000,000 a month narcotics ring smashed here this month. Carroll was indicted for mail fraud. Bob Pedergast and R. Emmet O'Malley, former state mail inspectors, were indicted in connection with an alleged "pay-off" in 1935 Missouri fire insurance rate compromise.

Milligan himself broke the case publicly when he asked Judge Carroll to order an accounting of certain funds held by trustees.

Federal agents have been investigating for months. They turned their information over to Milligan before the grand jury.

Trained by Murphy, after a flying visit here, commented: "Mr. Milligan is a very able and capable official, fully qualified to handle the Kansas City case. It is the policy of this office to support district attorneys in their fight for clean government."

Milligan returned in the massacre and vote fraud cases already had made him prominent in Missouri. Many believe he came to this as a possible candidate in 1940 to succeed Senator Harry S. Truman.

He was Milligan's brother, former Representative Jacob L. "Flick" Milligan, over whom Pedergast backed Truman in the 1928 Democratic primary.

The Milligans lived from Richmond, Mo., a little way country. While "Flick" was in Congress, his younger brother arrived home. When the 1932 Democratic landslide came along, Maurice Milligan had been private judge eight years and was back in private practice. He created a good bet for district attorneys.

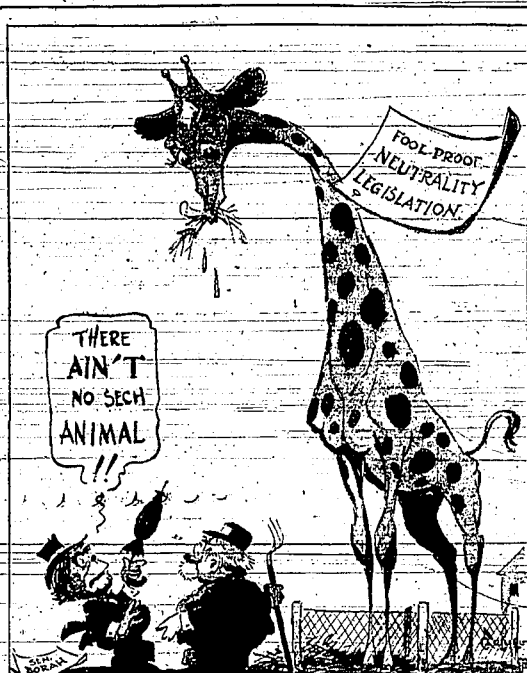

Construction of Grand River Dam Keeps Merchants' Tills Jangling

WANTHA, Okla., April 29.—A "new kind of boom" for Oklahoma is giving cash exhilaration to a once sleepy fire-country area about here.

Floodlights burn throughout the night as a three-shift, 24-hour schedule of labor speeds construction of the \$20,000,000 Grand river dam, largest "new underway" in the southwest.

Aided by public works administration funds, the state-created Grand river dam authority intends to bring to reality a dream which has persisted nearly 50 years among residents of this section.

World famous names have figured in Grand river's up-and-down. Henry Ford, Lloyd George and Benjamin Franklin, among them—but efforts to build the dam always collapsed until the state took hold in 1923 and the federal government in 1937.

Booms have been numerous in Oklahoma communities where oil wells overnight have brought sudden wealth, but they are new to this section of the state.

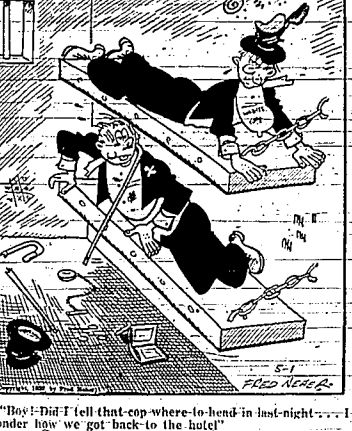

"The health of the child is the power of the nation" is the slogan of May Day—Child Health day of 1939. Twin Falls merchants are cooperating by offering to parents of south central Idaho the nourishing foods and type of clothing that will keep youngsters healthy.

CHILD ENTITLED TO EXAMINATION

Pre-School Round-up Permits Timely Correction of Defects

The child who is to enter school for the first time should have a thorough examination by a physician and by a dentist in the early part of the year. This allows time during the summer for correction of defects and for immunization of the child. It is necessary to have the child examined for defects in vision, hearing, and speech. It is also necessary to have the child vaccinated against diphtheria and smallpox. School boards are interested in the health of the child because a child who is not healthy cannot learn. It is especially important to have the child examined for defects in vision and hearing. A physical defect puts a child at a disadvantage with his schoolmates. Poor sight or hearing may make him seem dull in school and cause him to be discouraged and uninterested. Do not let your child reach school age with a handicap that can be removed. Ask yourself these questions:

- 1. Are his eyes bright, his cheeks rosy, his muscles firm, his posture erect?
- 2. Has he been vaccinated against diphtheria (nab) against typhoid fever if this is necessary?
- 3. Has he good habits of eating, sleeping, exercising, elimination, self-control?
- 4. May Day—Child Health Day is a good time to ask yourself these questions and to arrange to have your child examined by a physician and by a dentist.
- 5. Between the first and sixth birthdays children develop rapidly, and during these years their health strengthens the foundations of healthy body and mind that have been laid during infancy.
- 6. During the pre-school years the child forms many life-time habits, and it is during this time that he must learn to share with others and many other lessons which his parents can teach him by good example.
- 7. The work of training children should not be left to the mother alone. Parents should work together to bring out the best in their children.
- 8. When your child enters school in the fall he should not only be physically well but he should have learned how to share with others, to help his peers in study and play, and get along with other children.

Certificates of Birth Valuable

Will your child be able to prove his age and identity after he grows to be a man? A birth certificate is on file with the state health department before it is issued. It is the only record of birth, sex, name of both parents, and place of birth. A birth certificate is a valuable document. It is a record of vital statistics in the Twin Falls vicinity. And how can the children be taught what they owe a Democracy?

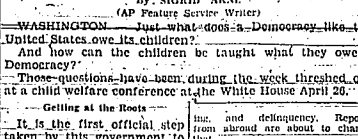
These questions have been during the week threshed out at a child welfare conference at the White House April 20.

FOUR POINTS FOR HEALTH PROGRAM

1. Start immunization against diphtheria when the baby is nine months old and immunize him against smallpox before he is 1 year old.
2. Keep him away from anyone who is ill. A person who has had a cold or "just a cough" may infect a baby and make him seriously ill. Never take the baby into crowded places, such as stores or theaters.
3. Keep flies and other insects away from him and from his food.
4. Boil his milk and drinking water from him and from his food.

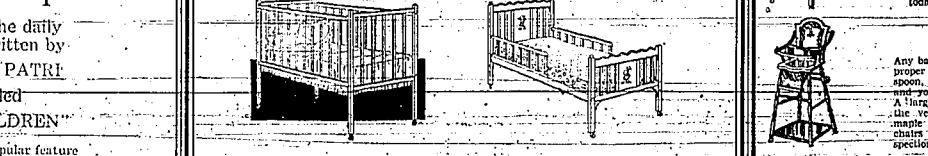

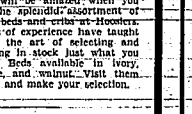
