

More than one Idaho farmer, is, beginning to wonder whether the state was wise in repealing its egg grading law during the last session, of, the legislature. Egg, prices have gone-down-und-for-some reason Idaho eggs are no longer in demand on the larger markets.

Yesterday news came out or bose time threatening surplus of eggs has resulted in the Idaha Association of Reinit Food Distributors sponsoring a statewide egg saile in Idaho among the retail grocers.

The reason advanced for this "threatening surplus" is that the more than 35,000 farms in Idaho, selling eggs to grocery stores have increased their laying flocks approximately 10 net cent.

That may be one of the reasons Idaho eggs are Pilling up on the market, but this explanitation does not account for the entire surplus by any means. Repeal of the Idaho egg grading law is having more of an adverse effect than many of the producers realize.

Those familiar with the principal egg marting law is having and the producers realize is on the west coast tell us that the market for Idaho eggs has been virtually ruined. Since Idaho repealed her egg law buyers complain they can't tell whether they are getting fresh eggs or baby chicks. Consequently great numbers of these eggs have to be "lopped off" to the "cracking plants" as the only means of immediate disposal. Even the average Idaho housputte is no longer positive she's getting first grade eggs. As one cominentator remarked, "eggs are eggs now, and the producer of poor eggs is pulling down the market for everyone."

If he Idaho farmers think there is need for a state egg law, and that recognized standards are unnecessary, they are fooling themselves. If there, is anything the consuming public wants fresh, it's eggs, and there can't be any question about the freshness.




