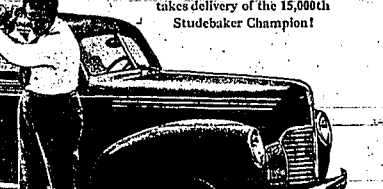

### CUT PRICE BAN NOW EFFECTIVE

#### Now Idaho Law Prohibits Sales Below Specified Price

BOISE, May 7 (AP)—Sale of merchandise below a specified mark-up price was outlawed in Idaho under terms of one of the approximately 100 acts of the 1929 legislature that went into effect today.

There was little significance in most of the measure that became effective today—the 50th day after adjournment of the legislature—since the more important measures carried emergency provisions that made them law at once.

Still largely undetermined was the status of 15 bills which Governor C. A. Bottolfsen vetoed. Secretary of State George H. Curtis declined to assume the veto, however, on grounds they were filed too late, and included the bills in the 1929 session laws.

**Cull Potatoes**

Besides the merchandise bill, others now operative include one outlawing shipment of cull potatoes except in certain containers, specifically marked as culls, and shipped; another creating the state planning board; others which regulate automobile drivers' licenses and licensing of automobiles and trucks.

Two laws do not become effective until July 1, one "levelled" the fruit and vegetable marketing act of 1927, and the other permitted further regulation of beer vendors.

The most far-reaching, however, was the "unfair sales act" which makes it a misdemeanor to sell merchandise at a price less than 6 per cent above cost to the wholesale dealer.

Exceptions would be held for perishable merchandise where there is present loss, where merchandise was imperfect, damaged or being discontinued; where merchandise was sold for final liquidation for charitable purposes or on contract to governmental departments, or where sold by an officer acting under court order.

**Idaho Grocers Sponsors Bill**

Idaho grocers sponsored the bill, and Lieutenant Governor Donald S. Whitehead, owner of a drug store here.

"The object of the legislation," he explained, "was to prevent use of too lenient. Similar legislation has been tried in a number of states and the Idaho law was modeled after one in California.

"I feel that it will have a salutary effect on business. It makes every line of merchandise stand on its own and should aid in correcting some practices we feel are unfair.

"He said it probably would affect cigarette prices and set at two packages for 25 cents the minimum retail price for 15-cent brands.

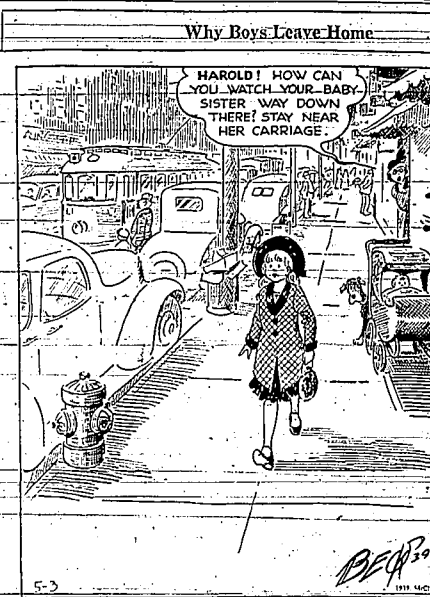

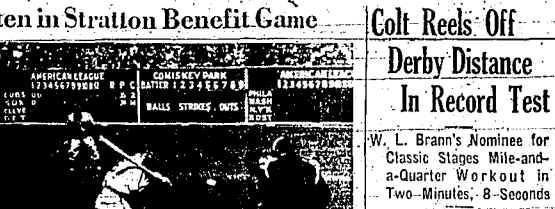
