### STATE COLLECTS ON LAND LOANS

#### Finance Commissioner Reports 11 Foreclosure Suits Pending

BOISE, May 10 (AP)—Idaho's department of public investments collected \$22,273 in past-due interest on delinquent farm mortgages since Jan. 1, State Finance Commissioner C. L. Jenkins reported today.

The collections go into the state endowment funds from which only the earnings may be spent. The endowment fund totals approximately \$15,000,000.

Foreclosure suits directed against the owners of 11 loan notes which are delinquent are ready for filing in district courts. S. Reed Miller, department attorney, said.

The loans are scattered over the state and the delinquency periods range from three to six years.

In some instances foreclosure proceedings have not been started in the department's campaign to put the endowment fund loans in a sound condition.

"Deeds to mortgaged lands have been given voluntarily in some instances and others the owners have brought their loans up to date through payment of past-due interest," he said.

The 1939 legislature conducted a sweeping investigation of the endowment fund after sessions were made that the state would lose several thousand dollars through the alleged failure to institute mortgage foreclosure proceedings promptly.

An Ada county district court opinion held that the state was bound by the statute of limitations, as it applied to mortgage loans, but subsequent ruling of federal district court here exempted the state from provisions of that law.

An appeal from the first opinion now is pending before the state supreme court.


