NEW LIFE-SAVING DEVICE REVIEWED

Modern Resuscitator Shown Before Large Crowd at Fire Station

A resuscitator and inhalator that will do all but resuscitate the dead was exhibited in Twin Falls at the fire station last evening before a large crowd by Jack Coombs, Salt Lake City, of the Universal Safety Appliance company.

Fleming, city police officers, employees of utility companies, safety workers, physicians, city commissioners and newspapermen were present at the demonstration.

Directed by a physician and an aircraft company engineer, the apparatus makes a victim breathe whether he wants to or not and performs the important function of filling deflated lungs effortlessly and without injury to the patient.

A rubber mask is pressed on the patient's face, pure oxygen, or oxygen diluted with air, is carried and the resuscitator is mechanically.

The machine maintains a proper rhythm of breathing and exhalates less air than is inhaled. Common flaws of artificial respiration, applied manually, is that rhythm is uneven, the pressure too great and the lungs remain deflated because all the air was forced out.

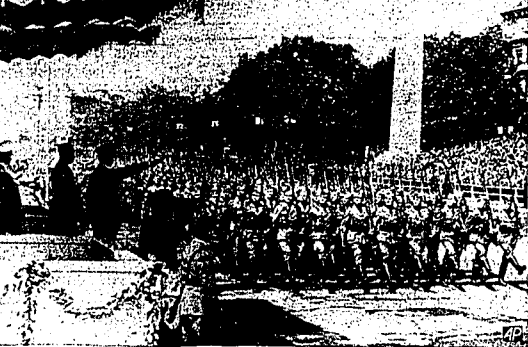
