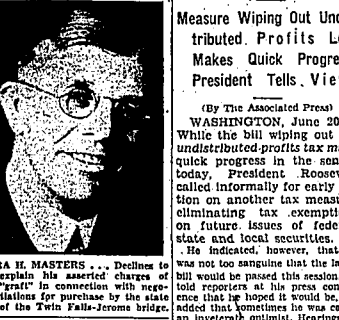

BALDERSTON NEW CHIEF AT NAMPA

Mayor's Vote Break's Dead-look on Appointment of Police Head

NAMPA, June 20 (AP) — Direction of Nampa's police department was turned over today to J. L. Balderston, former Idaho law enforcement commissioner and long-time former police chief at Pocatello.

His appointment by Mayor B. H. Weisman was confirmed by the Nampa city council last night when the mayor voted affirmatively to break a 3-to-2 deadlock.

Similar procedure followed the first submission of Balderston's name to the city council two weeks ago. At that time councilmen who opposed Balderston's appointment questioned its legality and the mayor withdrew the appointment.

Last night City Attorney V. K. Johnson informed councilmen the procedure was legal and the appointment was made.

Balderston succeeds Willard Harris, who resigned last night and announced he would accept a position as county deputy sheriff, replacing L. H. Wullstein, who resigned recently to accept an instructor position at Salt Lake City.

Balderston served as state law enforcement commissioner under then Governor Barzilla W. Clark in 1937 and 1938.

STATE'S CLAIM TO LAND URGED

Idaho Forester Points to 40,000 Acres to Be Acquired

BOISE, June 20 (AP) — Idaho was urged today by State Forester Edward Girard to "make steps to acquire" approximately 40,000 acres of federal grant lands "to which it is entitled."

He said the land had never been claimed, although it was granted to the state in 1850, and added:

"None of the leasing of such an amount of land would bring sufficient revenue with which to partially or completely maintain the land or forestry department."

Girard said the failure to acquire the land resulted from "inaccuracies, prior to homestead filings, contested claims, withdrawals and other factors."

505 QUAKES JOLT BOULDER REGION

Earth Tremors Bring Back Memories of Debate Over Project

WASHINGTON, June 20 (AP) — Many of the exploits old timers picked up their ears the other day to remember before a house committee to recurring earth tremors in the Boulder dam area.

Further by the statement by Admiral L. O. Colbert, coast and geodetic survey director, that 505 earthquakes were recorded in the region during the last year brought back memories of the stirring congressional debates of the middle '30s when opponents of the big Colorado river development freely predicted Boulder dam's eventual destruction by earthquake.

Against these warnings of "the greatest man-made disaster in history" were posed reports of world-famous engineers attesting to the safety of the black canyon dam site, but they served nevertheless to help delay congressional authorization of the project nearly a year.

Dusty pages of the Congressional Record tell the story of those debates in which senators like Arizona's Ashurst and Utah's Smoot used the earthquake issue as an argument against construction of Boulder dam.

It was Ashurst, apparently, who first touched off serious debate on that point in a senate then recently held by the tragic collapse of St. Francis dam, near Los Angeles, and the loss of between 400 and 500 lives.

Recalling testimony before the house irrigation committee by W. G. Clark, New York consultant engineer, to the effect that the Colorado "apparently runs through a really fissure" in the region of the dam site, Ashurst told the senate early in 1923 that the collapse of St. Francis dam "was the hanging out of a red lantern signal advising that we must be certain in these projects that we give safety and security."

"The only way to proceed is to be sure of the 'foundation,'" advised Ashurst. "Let engineers of national repute, engineers of large ability, be given opportunity to pass upon and approve this project, and you then will have removed what is now an insuperable obstacle in the way."

The then senator from Nevada, Francis L. Oddie, took the floor to reply to the alarmists of the Arizona.

"I've Oddie the Boulder dam site was 'as perfect a site as ever been selected for a dam.' 'There is, he added, 'no better site in the world than Boulder canyon for a dam—a safe site, a site that will maintain a dam and hold it as solid as Gibraltar for all time to come.'"

That assertion, however, did not stop the Boulder dam opponents, now in full cry and firing with every gun at what they believed was an outstanding weakness in the proposed project.

"We find," said Senator Smoot on May 1, 1928, "instead of solving the flood menace, it is proposed under this project to substitute for the existing menace an enormous experimental concrete dam, the like of which was never before tried in the world, and which will introduce grave elements of risk in its construction, and finally that when it ever is constructed it will stand in an earthquake area and on a spot where earthquakes have occurred in the past."

"Do you senators know," he asked "that you are being asked to substitute for a comparatively insignificant flood menace a menace to lives of thousands of people which may result in the greatest man-made disaster in history?"

"God knows," asserted the Utah senator at another point in his long speech, "there is danger enough without tilting it down; for I say now that if that dam is built, with all its faults, it will be the cause of earthquakes, and it goes out, it will be the greatest disaster that has ever occurred in the world, and the poor people in Imperial valley will be the very first that will be hurt."

"Not only is this whole thing experimental from the physical standpoint, it is an experiment which, if unsuccessful, is likely to lead to the most tremendous man-made catastrophe in history, no dam that has ever failed, indeed no dam in the world, and no collection of the greatest dams in the world ever approximate the magnitude of this single one. This dam is to cost \$20,000,000 acre feet of water."

"The Boulder reservoir will contain 22 million acre feet of water, and destroyed the lives of between 400 and 500 people when the St. Francis dam fell. We can not imagine the catastrophe that would follow the breaking of the dam here proposed."

Again, Oddie undertook to reply, characterizing as a "foolish statement" an assertion by Clark, the New York consulting engineer, that he had seen an earthquake loosing rock on one side of the canyon, and denying it ever had been proved that a quake occurred there.

"I believe," said Oddie, "that a statement of that kind is doing mankind more harm than a piece of legislation that is of the greatest importance and life-saving in character."

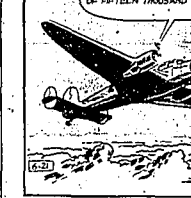

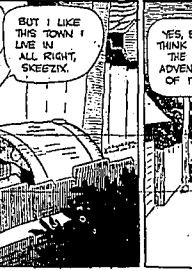
