IRONY STRESSED IN TRAFFIC TOLL

Idaho Official Terms Many July Highway Crashes 'Preventable'

BOISE, June 30 (AP) — Harry M. Raper, chief of the state enforcement commission, said today that many of the large incidents of the highway crashes during the past few months were "preventable."

"There is a lot of irony," he said, "in the fact that the United States, which has the right to life, liberty and the pursuit of happiness, in a situation of car accidents and roadblocks that leaves in its wake the slightest, the dead and the suffering."

"If we would only hang the mantle of courtesy over our real or fancied rights, much human misery would be eliminated."

Raper said 46 of the accidents in July, last year, occurred in broad daylight. In addition to the 14 deaths there were 60 injuries and property damage estimated at \$490,000.

The commissioner asked cooperation of the motoring public in the state by the state's recently named state safety bureau director.

"Banks is a pioneer in the cause of traffic safety in Idaho and his experience and estimates will qualify him for the position," Raper said.

Callahan Fixes Spending Blame

TACOMA, June 30 (AP) — There can be no curbing of government spending, until businessmen themselves stop a willingness to "drift" from buying their government to get their share of federal money being so "generously" distributed.

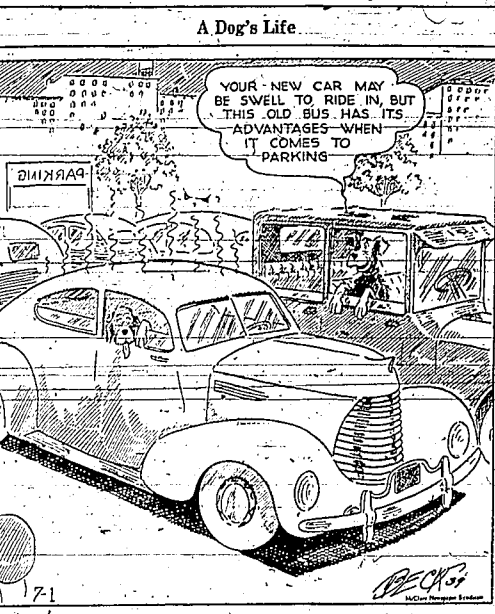
