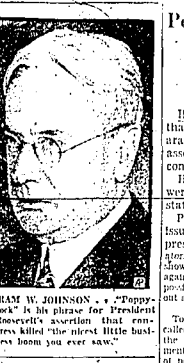

Banking Committee Lops \$310,000,000 Off Measure; Imposes Restrictions to Guard Against Business

(By The Associated Press) WASHINGTON, July 21—After chopping \$310,000,000 off the measure of the reconstruction bill, the senate banking committee voted tonight to hedge it around with restrictions to prevent the funds from being used in competition with existing business.

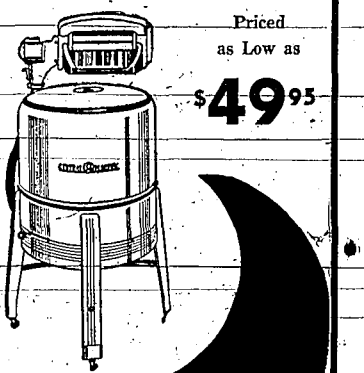

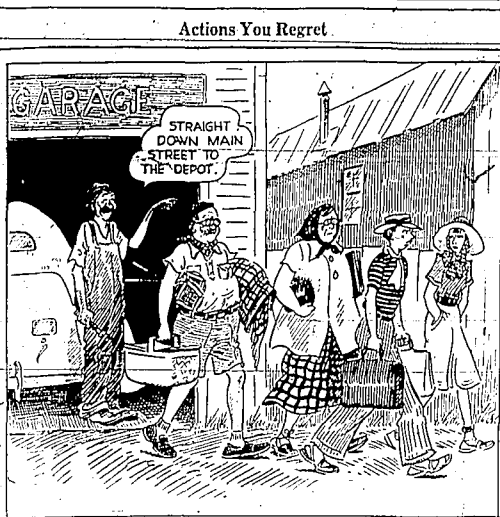

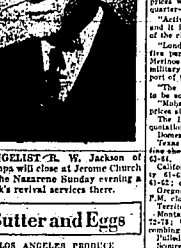
