### COSTS INCREASE FOR GOVERNMENT

#### Idaho State Expenditures Rise \$18,000,000 in Nine Bienniums

BOISE, Aug. 3 (AP)—In the past nine bienniums, cost of Idaho state government increased nearly \$18,000,000, Donald A. Callahan, who retired as state comptroller pending outcome of a test suit determining constitutionality of his office, calculated.

For 1929-1930 the cost was \$29,084,166; for 1931-1932, \$38,642,008, and for 1933-1934, \$42,581,642.

### SWEEPING CRIME PROBE LAUNCHED

#### Lepke Manhunt Prompts Nationwide Grand Jury Investigation

NEW YORK, Aug. 3 (AP)—The government disclosed today that a special grand jury had been appointed to act as an extraordinary national grand jury for the purpose of leading investigators to the hiding places of Louis (Lepke) Buchalter, New York boss racketeer, and other long-hunted fugitives.

With this step, which federal authorities said had the approval of Attorney General Murphy, the nationwide manhunt for Lepke and his associates is being stepped up.

Already three hunches over the head of the grand jury—led by Thomas J. Dewey, district attorney of New York—have been followed up.

The most dangerous individual fugitive in the United States, a \$25,000 bond-or-kill city warrant.

The additional federal grand jury will hold its opening session Monday in New York City, the seat of the federal bureau of investigation, which will take the almost encyclopedic mass of information about criminals ever assembled in one grand jury room. 600 reports aggregating more than 60,000 pages.

The inquiry, not to be confined to this federal district, will draw material from "everywhere" from various other cities as far afield as the Mississippi and information also will be sought from the Pacific coast and the southwestern border.

### Idaho Motorists

#### Portlet Licenses

BOISE, Aug. 3 (AP)—Henry M. Rastner, state law enforcement commissioner, said today 512 motorists had been deprived of the right to drive automobiles in Idaho through driver's license revocations or suspensions.

Fifty-seven were out-of-state drivers, he said. Of the others, 109 had their licenses suspended, 246 revoked.

All were for drunken driving. Licenses of 38 Idaho county drivers were taken away and of 38 Canyon county motorists.

New Teton county drivers lost 31 licenses; Blaine, 25; Twin Falls, 20; Shoshone, 25; Coconino, Dingman and Bonneville, 16 each.

### STATE MOVES TO CURTAIL RELIEF

#### Pennsylvania Restricts Public Assistance Rolls to Workers

HARRISBURG, Pa., Aug. 3 (AP)—Pennsylvania officials, putting into effect a "work or get off relief" law affecting upwards of 200,000 persons, began searching today for jobs with which to make the new plan work.

The law was designed to cut relief costs that have been averaging \$100,000,000 a year. It was passed in the closing days of the recent Republican-boosted legislature over the protests of the Democratic minority.

Pennsylvania has 765,000 persons on relief now. Of these only one member of a family was certified as employable to get the plan working.

The state-owned area to be given jobs on county projects to be conducted separately from the federal works projects. The law stipulates the "drilling wages" must be paid. In another clause of the bill for public assistance, the state, in six months, has required \$500,000 by increasing persons who look relief they did not deserve. The total that will be required from these "chiselers" will total \$1,000,000 by the end of the year, officials estimate.

### Student Expense Low at U. I. S. B.

POCATELLO, Aug. 3 (AP)—That typical Southern Branch student spends almost \$100 less on a year's education than the average amount spent by students attending other western colleges was revealed in a pamphlet, "The Cost of Going to College," published by the United States office of education. Comparative figures found on pages 11-14 of the pamphlet show that the average annual expense for a year at neighboring institutions average \$450.50. It is possible to attend the branch for a minimum of \$125.10, the average at other western colleges is \$356.

The survey also reveals a difference in expenses between the University of Idaho at Moscow and the Southern Branch at Pocatello. The typical expenses for a year at Moscow being \$450 which is \$75 more than at the branch, and the minimum being \$250.

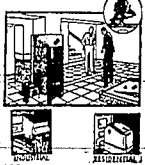

## BUTTER OUTPUT GAIN RECORDED

**Idaho Creameries Turn Out 3,510,000 Pounds in Month**  
BOISE, Aug. 3.—Creameries in Idaho produced nearly 10,000 pounds more butter than for the preceding month, turning out a total of 3,510,000 pounds, Richard C. Ross, regional agricultural statistician, reported today.

The May production was 3,400,000 pounds, the average for June for the years 1930 to 1937 was 2,855,000 pounds.

Total United States production for the month was 20,133,000 pounds, compared with 22,200,000 the previous month and 20,240,000 in June, 1938.

Cheese production also increased over the United States from 69,400,000 pounds in May to 68,200,000 in June. Production for the previous month was less, however, than in June, 1938, when 72,370,000 pounds were produced.

"Wide-spread rains in June brought about a marked improvement in pasture conditions in the important dairy states," Ross said. "Improved pasture along with a liberal supply of feed has increased the carrying capacity by high level of milk production during the next several months."

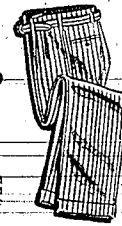
