Those opposed to anything that will pare the way to a return of prohibition should not under-estimate Mr. Kessler's "hope" that his initiative measure will be placed before the voters. On previous occasions he has demon-strated his ability to make such "hópes" materialize, and in this instance he will most likely produce the required signatures. Liquor control always has been a serious problem. Previous to prohibition there is no doubt that liquor had gotten out a control in he United States — so much so that prohi-bition seemed the only solution But prohib-liton also had its faults, principally because of the rackets that came into being as its off-porting:

Then the pendulum of public dominant swung to the other extreme and prohibition was discarded, with the hope that the Ameri-can people had learned their lesson — that laws and moderation would be respected. Now the pendulum is swinging the other way, and there is real need for some sort of solution. Whether, Mr. Kessler's plans are the
