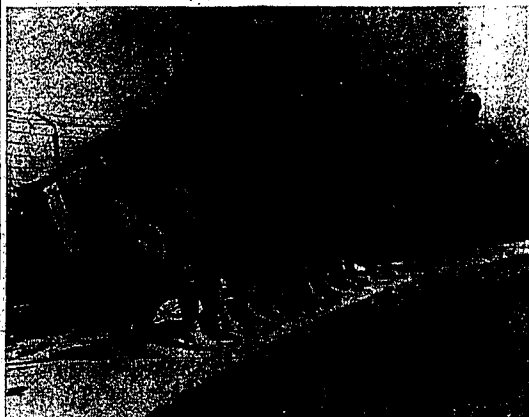

FOOD POISONING BRINGS WARNING

Idaho Public Health Service Points to Dangers Following Outbreak

BOISE, Aug. 18 (AP)—Idaho housewives and others engaged in canning fruits and vegetables were warned today to take extra precautions to guard against food poisoning...

"With death resulting from over 60 per cent of all recognized cases of food poisoning, it is not surprising that a definite increase in the number of reported cases of botulism during the past year has been noted..."

"All canned vegetables and meats except those canned under adequate steam pressure should be subjected to minutes before being eaten or tasted..."

"Everybody should learn the signs of spoiled canned food. If the lid is bulged, if the contents look milky, if it gives off a foul odor..."

"It is not safe even to taste suspicious food to find out if it is spoiled..."

"It is significant that since 1923 outbreaks of botulism poisoning have been almost entirely confined to commercially canned products in the United States..."

Latah-Idaho and Madison County Projects Total \$142,631

BOISE, Aug. 16 (AP)—Bids on four road projects which will cost \$142,631 were opened today by the State Engineer at the Idaho State Capitol building here.

The Idaho Construction company of Boise, with a bid of \$127,254, was low for constructing roadbed, drainage structure including a 250-foot concrete culvert and crushed rock surfacing on 2,500 miles of the North and South highways from Mexico west to Latah county.

With a bid of \$110,376, McEuse and Estey, Inc. of Spokane, Wash., was low for re-building 1,500 miles of the Moscow-Pulaski highway, 2,500 miles of the 160-mile-long North and South highways in Latah county.

With a bid of \$25,574, was low for re-building 47 miles of the Whitebird-hill and 11.3 miles between Portland and Goddard on the North and South highways in Idaho county.

The engineers estimate was \$58,600.

PHOSPHATE BEDS LEASING FAVORED

State Land Board Moves for Early Production of Fertilizer

BOISE, Aug. 18 (AP)—The Idaho land board, in an almost day-long session, voted on Tuesday to favor the leasing of state phosphate beds in southwestern Idaho and agreed to work for production from them of low-cost farm fertilizer.

The board, of which Governor C. A. Botwin is chairman, named State Land Commissioner C. Van Clark and State Land Agent Houston Hill to appear with members of the board at the western phosphate conference which will be conducted in Pocatello Aug. 21.

The board agreed that the state's royalty should be from 25 to 30 cents a ton for phosphate rock taken from its lands.

"Thousands of dollars of revenue in the years to come will pour into the state endowment which is used to maintain our educational and other institutions," Clark said.

"The board realizes that agriculture must fertilize with phosphate, and it is in order to produce proper crops, and that it is highly essential that the fertilizer should be produced at the lowest possible cost to the farmers."
