WAY SEEN OPEN FOR NEGOTIATION

France, Continuing Preparations, Sights Prolonged Crisis

PARIS, Aug. 28 (AP)—Diplomatic circles considered tonight that Britain's new note to Germany might have paved the way for long negotiations for settlement of the European crisis.

After reading the text of the note which the British raised to Berlin, French circles said that only a "binding stake" by Hitler's refusal would keep the crisis from dragging out perhaps for weeks.

The British note, they indicated, was designed to maneuver Hitler into a technical and legal argument over his position as a long-term negotiator. Premier Daladier and Prime Minister Chamberlain in personal messages.

While diplomats continued efforts to find a solution, Paris put itself in fighting trim to resist attack from the air.

Hundreds of thousands of persons joined those who already had come into the country. Railroad stations were jammed with families sitting forlornly on suitcases and boxes containing cherished possessions.

While France waited there was no change in her position. Hitler's rejection of Daladier's suggestion that Germany negotiate directly with Poland if he wanted peace, French sources said.

"Hitler must back down now or we fight."

In diplomatic circles it was reported the London note, stripped of diplomatic wording, stated practically the same position as that of France as far as Hitler's demands for return of Danzig and the Polish corridor are concerned.

Censorship Derided

The French government continued its preparations for war by prohibiting citizenship of men and photographs. Effective immediately, all printed publications, radio broadcasts and motion picture presentations must be submitted for approval to a newly-formed general information service.

The nation approached the last stages in full preparation. There was progressive mobilization of troops, regulation of transportation facilities and partial evacuation of Paris.

Lighted signs were banned in the capital. Householders were told their electricity would be cut off if they allowed light to shine out of windows or doors.

A total of about 3,000,000 men were under arms in the French empire.

Chiropractors of Idaho Sets Pace

BOISE, Aug. 28 (AP)—Idaho chiropractors, their state president asserted here today, have the highest educational standards of those of any state in America.

As a result, he said, "other states are permitting their chiropractic regulations after those in effect in Idaho."

Dr. M. J. Higgins of Coeur d'Alene, president of the Idaho State Chiropractors' association, which began its three-day, 27th annual convention here today, said Idaho chiropractors had achieved a high rating because they "have picked themselves up by their own bootstraps."

"By adopting stringent qualifications for practice, we have cleared the ranks of the unscrupulous and have laid out the unethical practitioners," he said.

"We have adopted a code of ethics that other states are copying."

Although less than 100 chiropractors are practicing in Idaho, registration at the convention totaled 176 with many out-of-state chiropractors in attendance.

Stability Sighted For Wheat Crop

WASHINGTON, Aug. 28 (AP)—The agriculture department predicted today that the nation's wheat harvest would plant a 1940 acreage about equal to that planned for this year and that wheat prices in the United States would remain above world levels.

Although war scares have given a lift to wheat prices recently, the department economists noted that the world wheat supply was largely unchanged in history and prices in world markets the lowest in more than five years.

Prices in this country have been supported by the government loans on wheat at Kansas City recently averaged about 3 cents a bushel below a year ago. Prices for this same wheat at Liverpool, England, were 44 cents lower.

JAPAN TURNS TO AGED STATESMAN

General Abe Called to Carry Out Isolationist Policy

TOKYO, Aug. 27 (The-day) (AP)—General Nobuyuki Abe, a moderate called from three years' retirement, began today constructing a new government to carry out the isolationist policy to which Japan turned after Germany concluded her non-aggression pact with Soviet Russia.

Engineer Hirohito had named Abe on the 64-year-old Abe pronounced Abe-ben, without access to form a cabinet to replace that of Baron Kichiro Hirayama. The latter stepped down because of the emperor's about-face from the old foreign policy—symbolized by the Japanese-German-Hitler non-aggression pact.

While Japan's attention for possible move against Manchuria or south China, Abe faces a difficult task in keeping clear of international complications which might threaten the Japanese empire in China.

At the same time Abe, former inspector-general of military education and once acting war minister, faced the task of maintaining a middle course between extreme nationalists and those favoring friendship with the United States and Great Britain, a policy toward which he was reported authoritatively to be inclined.
