Man's Conduct Under Scrutiny

State Nears Close of Evidence at Trial of Former Mayor

The conduct and financial affairs of Duncan M. Johnston, former Twin Falls mayor, were reviewed by 18 state witnesses yesterday as the commonwealth prepared to rest its case in Johnston's second trial for the murder of Governor Olson.

The day's parade brought to 42 the number of witnesses called from four states and the District of Columbia to testify for the commonwealth.

Possibly by noon today Special Prosecutor Edward Babcock and Assistant Attorney General Robert Beckwith of Boise will advise the state rest its case.

Defense attorneys W. D. Dunn and T. R. Robertson, Jr., will defend their client in the trial which has its opening on Monday, April 24, when Olson's death certificate was filed with the state.

Johnston previously was sentenced to life imprisonment but the state supreme court granted him a new trial last Jan. 15.

Yesterday saw the admission of the state's 40th, 41st and 42nd witnesses, including the charging of the dead man, the ledger account of the bank in which Johnston had a checking account in 1932 and Olson's gasoline service station check.

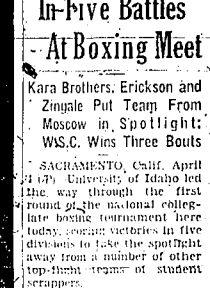

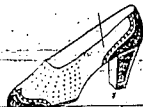
