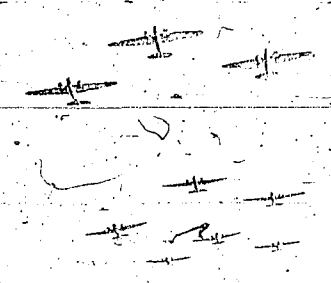

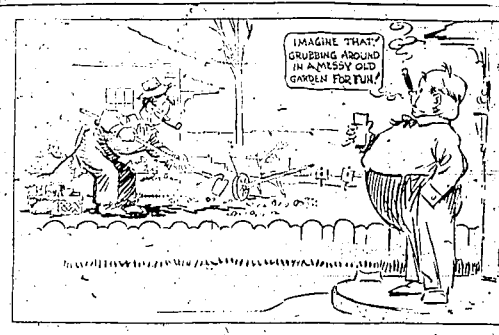

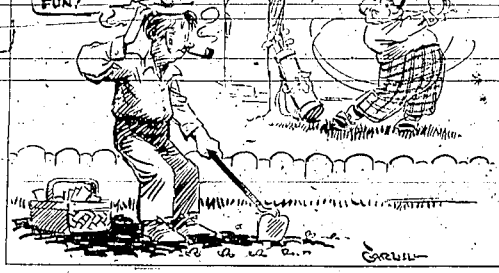

POLICE ACCEPT CHILD'S STORY

Juvenile Court to Deal With Girl Witness to Slaying of Mother, Children

LOS ANGELES, April 6 (AP)—Police accepted today the 11-year-old Chloé Davis' story of the quadruple slaying of her mother, two sisters and a brother, then quietly found themselves returned by her father's attorney for "relentless hours of questioning."

A writ for the girl's release on a demand of \$1000 was made, but a hearing was delayed until Monday afternoon. She has been held on a booking of suspicion of murder since "Thursday, when the bodies of Mrs. Lollita Davis, 30, Daphne, 10, Deborah Ann, 7, and Margaret, 3, were found scattered to death or intubility in the family home.

The slaying, which broke girl's slaps down her back, told such an amazing tale of the deaths that authorities at first were unwilling to believe her.

She said her mother bludgeoned the three children, then struck Chloé in the face with the hammer. The girl added that she beat her mother, thereby giving her a chance to cut her, then struck Marjorie to make him stop screaming.

The mother, who was bleeding from the slashed wrists, Marjorie's blood, and the blood of the children, picked up a hospital of skull fractures.

Chloé said she herself was struck by her mother at one point during the gory attack.

Police Chief Captain Elmer Edwards, police homicide chief, to encourage earlier that he was prepared to hear her of all the killings. But today he commented:

"We believe she is telling the truth. We will turn her over to the juvenile court. It remains for the court to determine what steps will be taken."

Mrs. Ainsie Lang, who was elected president of southern Idaho's Alaska Sourdoughs at their annual meeting last week in Jerome—the first woman accorded that honor—has lived in Twin Falls for the past twelve years, but she traveled thousands of miles before coming to this city. Her wish was to travel, she left her home in Germany as a young girl and came alone to the United States, arriving first in Washington, D. C. A short time later, she traveled across the continent and was living in San Francisco when the first auriferous gold rush in Alaska drew hundreds of people to search for the treasure hidden in the ice north.

Then Miss Ainsie Deibert, she read of the gold rush in San Francisco papers and, "just decided I wanted to go." She sailed for Alaska in November, 30, with Mrs. White and her two sons of San Francisco, she went in 1927 to Alaska where she worked for twenty-one years, following every major gold rush during that time.

Things happened during that twenty-one years, but the thing for which she is best known is her marriage to a man named Dawson, who was a prospector in the Yukon territory, who was married to her in October, 1908, at Nome.

"We were three months on the trail after we left the little town of Nome," this Alaska pioneer recalled, "until we reached Dawson, our destination."

Things as carried 100 pounds of provisions upon our backs, over the Chilkoot pass, and down to Lake Lindeman. There we built boats and sent down the Yukon river and through other lakes until we reached Dawson.

Dawson, in the heart of the Klondike territory, was the scene of Mrs. Lang's first marriage. The couple remained in Nome until 1920, when they went to Fairbanks. Remaining there for six years, they went to Hilltop on the Hilarious river in 1926. At that time a railroad was being built from the town of Hilltop, and the couple came out there until 1926 when they came out to Anchorage.

After three years in Anchorage, they came out of Alaska "for good" in 1929.

SOLOONS' BACKING FOR VANDENBERG

Capper and McNary Endorse Colleague as Friend of Agriculture

WASHINGTON, April 6 (AP)—Two senators, Capper of Kansas and McNary of Oregon, endorsed today Vandenberg (R-Mich.) as a friend of agriculture as the Vandenberg forces launched a nationwide drive for votes in the Nebraska presidential preference primary next Thursday.

The Michigan senator will be on the ballot with Thomas E. Dewey, New York's conservative attorney, to whom he has all of Vandenberg's 24 Republican delegates in a contest. Vandenberg's friends are confident of the fact that the political influence of the Vandenberg results on other states, had caused them to step up the tempo of their Nebraska campaign.

In messages similar in phraseology, McNary, the senate's Republican leader and Capper said they felt that the Vandenberg farmer would be "safe" with Vandenberg, who is a farmer himself. McNary, a preliminary agricultural bill will send 14 delegates to the national convention, but not technically bound to support the winner of the preference primary.

Both McNary and Capper said they favored the farm program and both expressed confidence in Vandenberg's ability to deal with it.

The battle for the Nebraska delegation attracted interest with a detail by Governor Harold E. Stearns of Minnesota that he had informed Vandenberg friends he hoped to influence Minnesota's Republican delegation to support Dewey for the presidential nomination.

Washington sources and the governor had given them to understand in communications to them that he favored Dewey's candidacy.

RUTLEDGE URGES FORESTRY SHIFT

Utah Livestockmen Hear Grazing Chief Argue for Transfer

SALT LAKE CITY, April 6 (AP)—Utah livestockmen discussed today a report by R. H. Rutledge, federal grazing service director, that they give a "business man's approach" to the transfer of the federal grazing service to the interior department.

Rutledge, former intermountain regional forester for the forest service, was speaker at the Utah Cattlemen and Horse Growers' association convention, which concludes tonight.

He asserted that transfer of the forest service to the interior department would result in elimination of much duplicated effort and effect a possible saving of 20 to 25 per cent in cost of administration.

He termed Secretary Weeks a "best executive and said he had given the grazing bureau director a free hand.

"I am asked repeatedly about reorganization but that is not a new thought to me," Rutledge said. "Nearly 10 years ago I placed my thoughts on paper."

He then read a letter he said he wrote to then Congressman Don B. Colton on April 28, 1922, advocating the reorganization now proposed by Secretary Weeks.

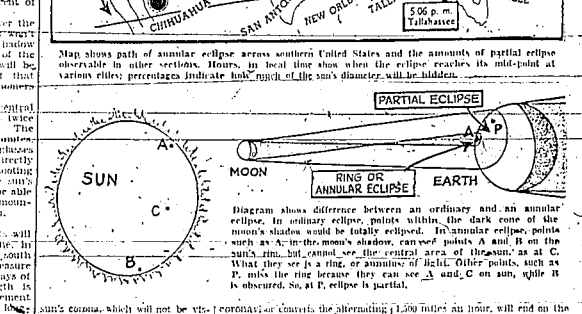
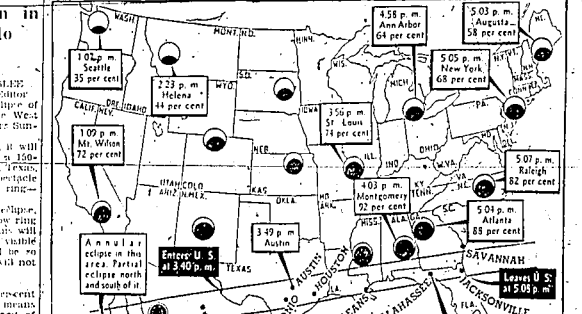
