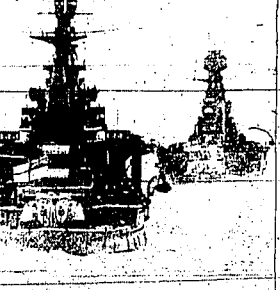

Fighting Planes Supplement Warships in Battle Off Norway's Coast

LONDON, April 10.—The future course of the European war, was believed to be at stake today in the greatest naval battle since Jutland reported today off the storm lashed coasts of Norway.

The reported encounter was expected to decide the possibility of the allies getting immediate aid to Norway against the German invasion.

The admiralty, true to its tradition of silence, shielded the trend of any encounter with reluctance to talk.

Reports from Scandinavian sources, however, described the large scale encounter between heavy units of the British grand fleet and Germany's high seas fleet, each supported by hundreds of aircraft.

Reports of Damage An early morning announcement said that the royal air force had seriously damaged a German cruiser in Bergen...

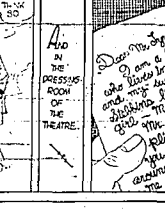

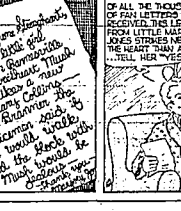

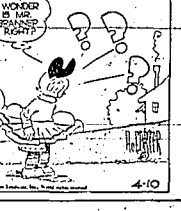
