## PRESIDENT'S ACTION HITS SUGAR BLOC

Roosevelt Proposes Continuation of 1937 Quota Law, Blasting Hopes for Expanded Domestic Industry

WASHINGTON, April 12 (AP)—Hopes for an expanded domestic sugar industry faded today when President Roosevelt proposed a continuation of the 1937 quota law.

He wrote Chairman Jones (D., Cal.) of the house agriculture committee, that "it seems clear that no sugar legislation is necessary required at this time."

Royal Air Force Admits Loss of Eight Planes in Day's Fightings-Nazi Supply Vessels Hit

LONDON, April 12 (Saturday)—The Evening Telegraph, British news agency, in a Stockholm dispatch early today said heavy British air action had been carried out against German supply ships.

LONDON, April 12—Britain corked the Skagerrak and Kattegat today with mines designed to cut the lifeline of Germany's expeditionary force in Norway and British planes pounced on the cork light dispatch withering fire from German warships, planes and anti-aircraft defenses.

The air ministry said the royal air force lost eight planes in the day's encounters while searching Danish and Norwegian waters for units of the German fleet returning to their base.
